A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

I think that things have gone pretty well with our gymnasium Masses. We don't have the beauty of a church and there is a lot of effort involved in setting up and tearing down with these Masses, but I think that they have been very reverent and prayerful. A word to those who are concerned: our gym is handicap

accessible. We have reserved handicap parking all along the south side of the gym, there are no steps required for entry, and there is an electric door for entrance.

This weekend is Scout Sunday. We recognize our Boys Scouts and Girl Scouts at the 9:00 a.m. Mass.

We hope and pray that the pandemic is winding down. As I am writing this column, we priests at St. Charles have not been hit, but we have covered Masses in five other parishes for priests who have been sick. I'm wearing a mask more often than I used to.

Renovation, Week Five. The progress has been very impressive so far. More concrete has been poured and the sanctuary steps in both church and chapel are now shaped. Terrazzo flooring is now installed in a cool pattern around the baptismal font and it has been poured under all the pew areas on the north side of the church. After it sets for a few days, the terrazzo will be ground down. The marble is due to arrive this week from Italy. The corpus for our new crucifix is here from Germany and a crew of parishioners have nearly completed the cross to back it up. The ceiling above the chapel tabernacle has been removed and crews are waiting for warmer weather to turn off the heat and relocate the water pipes, allowing us to raise the ceiling. The hearing loop system is installed and it does work. A person who has hearing aids with a T-coil button or a person who borrows one of our hearing packs will be able to tune directly into the sound system. Pictured below is the cupola area above the altar. After this is covered in drywall, painted angels will surround the opening and the new crucifix will be suspended below. Five weeks down, 15 to go.
