The upcoming Diocesan Eucharistic Conference will be held at St. Charles this Saturday, January 14, from 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. It should be a great opportunity to be fed in our faith by our Bishop. Bishop Rhoades will give two conferences and have a question-and-answer session. We

Because of the Eucharistic Conference, we will not have our regular Saturday morning 8:15 a.m. Mass next weekend. We will maintain our regular Saturday confession schedule, both in the morning and afternoon.



Pre-K4 & Kindergarten Registration Coming Soon! January 17, 2023!

I wish to invite you to our Kindergarten & Pre-Kindergarten registration day on Tuesday, January 17th. Registration will be held in the afternoon from 1:15 p.m.-2:30 p.m. in Rooms C & D of the Hession Center, or you may attend the evening session from 6:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. All parents are asked to park in the rear of the school in the church parking lot and enter through door # 3 near the gym. If unable to attend, please call the school office (484-3392) to arrange for an alternate registration day.



Kindergarten: For this coming school year 2023-2024, we will be offering full-day Kindergarten with a classroom size limit of 23 students per class with an aide assisting the teacher. Our school day runs from 7:50 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. If needed, for an additional fee, Beforecare and Aftercare service is available for

all students.

The registration fee of \$50 is included in the overall tuition costs and is not a required payment at this time.

Pre-Kindergarten four-year-old Program: We will be offering two sections of five-day Pre-Kindergarten classes (A.M., P.M., or Full-day). Our morning program will run from 7:50 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. and our afternoon program will run from 11:50 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. A separate \$50 Pre-K registration fee is required.

Our January registration for our Kindergarten and Pre-K 4 Programs is early enough to ensure that parish families of St. Charles Borromeo have a first opportunity to register their children. Please bring to registration:

- 1. A copy of your child's birth certificate and baptismal certificate even if baptized at St. Charles
- 2. A copy of your child's immunization record
- 3. The \$50.00 nonrefundable registration fee (PreK)

This includes orders from the RaiseRight app and website. Please note that SCRIP has no control of this charge, and it is the first time RaiseRight has increased this fee since 2011. We recommend grouping multiple retailers in the same order whenever possible to help reduce costs.

Eucharistic Reflection for January Transformation in Christ.

The Eucharist enables in us a personal and moral transformation that reaches out to every sphere of human life. The love of Christ can permeate all our relationships: with our families, friends, and neighbors. Our relationship with Christ extends to all human beings, whom we are to love with that very same love that forms our communion with the Lord. This love extends particularly and preferentially to the poor and the most vulnerable. We all need to be consistent in bringing the love of Christ not only to our personal lives, but also to every dimension of our public lives. Lay people who exercise some form of public authority have a special responsibility to form their consciences in accord with the Church's faith and the moral law, and to serve the human family by upholding human life and dignity. Eucharistic Saint for Jan - St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

She was born in New York City in 1774 and belonged to New York's high society. Reared a staunch Episcopalian, she learned the value of prayer, Scripture and a nightly examination of conscience. Elizabeth married a wealthy businessman, but at age 30, she became widowed and penniless, with five small children to support. While in Italy with her dying husband, Elizabeth witnessed the Catholic faith in action. Three basic points led her to become a Catholic: belief in the Real Presence, devotion to the Blessed Mother and conviction that the Catholic Church led back to the apostles and to Christ. To support her children, she opened a school in Baltimore, from which the Sisters of Charity were formed. She died in 1821 and became the first American-born citizen to be canonized. 
BE A SUMMER MISSIONARY IN OUR DIOCESE: TOTUS TUUS APPLICATION OPEN




SIGN UP NOW TO TAKE HOME THE ST. CHARLES VOCATION CROSS Months of JANUARY & FEBRUARY
