A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR . . .

Next weekend, Fr. Bernard Bonnot will join us for Masses and talk about the work of *Unbound*, a Catholic ministry that allows us to sponsor children and elderly in developing countries. More information can be found at www.unbound.org.

As we have begun our new year, the world around us is looking back and reflecting on the year behind us. We should probably do the same. 2018 was a year of some highs and lows.

To begin with the pain: it was a year of heartache as we learned more of the history of clerical scandals. It has been a time for deep reflection, prayer for victims, and asking for healing in our Church.

It was also a year of joy. Our parish was blessed with some wonderful moments this year. Fr. Nathan Maskal was ordained a priest on June 2, and celebrated his First Mass here at St. Charles the next day. Sister Mary Ann Burkhardt took her final vows as a consecrated hermit on July 6, and Sr. Rose Caritas (formerly Karen Robertson) made her final vows with the Poor Clare sisters on December 12. Our parish prayers for vocations have seen results.

It was a year of new initiatives for deepening our faith lives. In addition to our Advent and Lenten days of recollection, we began a Saturday morning women's prayer group, a Sunday afternoon Bible study, and two new groups of Alpha. We have had a good response as we are now organizing small faith-sharing groups.

We made efforts to reach beyond our parish this year. We joined the people of St. Patrick Parish for a fascinating Vietnamese Tet celebration and lively Our Lady of Guadalupe events. Following a mission visit by a bishop from East Africa, we began a parish twinning relationship with a seminary in Fort Portal, Uganda.

We had several other unusual events this year: We took two buses of seniors to Maria Stein for a day of prayer in their relic chapel; we welcomed the Franciscan celebration of Portiuncula Day here at St. Charles; and we hosted a concert of sacred music by a classically-trained *a capella* choir from Ohio.

We are working on improving parish communications, launching a new website, installing electronic signs and trying an old-fashioned postcard campaign this year.

Our parish school continued to thrive, growing in numbers and adding a new pre-school for 4-year-olds.

Most important, though, this was a year of prayer. We welcomed 95 new Catholics into the parish in baptism and we celebrated the funerals of 53 beloved parishioners who died, entrusting them to the gentle love of the Savior. The Masses, the rosaries, the confessions, the anointings, and the prayers of our parish have been our source of strength. May the Lord continue to bless us in this new year.


