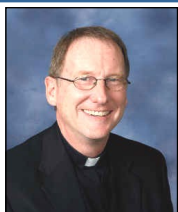

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We welcome this weekend Fr. Bob McAleer from Unbound Ministries. He will explain the Unbound program and show how we can help those who live in areas of poverty, one person at a time.

The Fort Wayne March for Life will take place this Saturday, January 28, beginning at the St. Francis Performing Arts Center, 431 W. Berry St. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and a program will begin at noon, featuring speaker Katie Shaw, a pro-life advocate who speaks particularly on behalf of those with Down Syndrome. After the program, there will be a peaceful march through downtown Fort Wayne, quietly witnessing our belief that all human life is sacred.

We are blessed to have three priests at St. Charles, and we try to be as generous as we can in helping other parishes if their priest is sick or traveling. This weekend, since we have a visiting priest from Unbound, St. Charles priests are covering Masses at St. Francis in Pierceton and also St. Louis, Besancon. Since Christmas, we have covered weekend Masses in three other parishes as well.

I share a thought after covering a weekend Mass in a parish outside of Fort Wayne. I would estimate that there were 100 people attending the Mass. Only one was under the age of 10 and two others were under the age of 20. I am glad to be at St. Charles, where the future looks bright with so many children. We are happy to have our nursery available during the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses, and we are fortunate to have a Cry Room and a Gathering Space with speakers for times when children are noisy. Our children are God's great blessing.

Your rebates are ready! Credit statements for the last half of 2022 are available for pickup. This is the money that you earned from purchasing **SCRIP**. If you have a student at St. Charles school, your statement went home with your child this past week. If you don't have a student, please pick up your statement at **SCRIP** sales on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday. Or, you can also stop by the **SCRIP** office during the week between 8:30 a.m. and noon.

What should I do with my SCRIP credit statement? Please treat your statement as you would cash, and we encourage you to use it as soon as possible.

- 1. Choose how to spend your money.** The funds can be used for more than just tuition at any school. Your earnings can be donated to St. Vincent DePaul Society, general tuition assistance, student lunch accounts, capital improvement fund, teacher classroom supplies, vacation bible school, or religious education tuition. The option for Family Rebate Check is cash back to the customer in the form of a check (must be at least \$20, but you can combine with past credit statements).
- 2. Don't forget to sign the credit statement.** Signatures are required!
- 3. Give your completed statement to the SCRIP office.**

**EUCCHARISTIC REFLECTION FOR JANUARY:
 TRANSFORMATION IN CHRIST**



The person who shares worthily in the Eucharist is enabled more and more to live the new law of love given by Christ precisely because Christ communicates Himself to us in the sacrament of the

altar. The moral life of the Christian flows from and is nourished by the inexhaustible source of holiness that is found in the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. The personal and moral transformation that is sustained by the Eucharist reaches out to every sphere of human life. The love of Christ can permeate all our relationships: with our families, our friends, and our neighbors. It can also reshape the life of our society as a whole. Our relationship with Christ extends to all human beings, whom we are to love with that very same love that forms our communion with the Lord. This love extends particularly and "preferentially" to the poor and the most vulnerable. We all need to be consistent in bringing the love of Christ not only to our personal lives, but also to every dimension of our public lives. It is the role of the laity to transform social relations in accord with the love of Christ, which is carried out concretely in actions that work for the objective common good. Lay people who exercise some form of public authority have a special responsibility to form their consciences in accord with the Church's faith and the moral law, and to serve the human family by upholding human life and dignity.
