

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Pope Francis is planning a world-wide synod in which he wants to hear the thoughts of Catholics around the globe. Our diocese is organizing "listening sessions" in order for people to speak. Our insights will be compiled and sent to the Vatican. Everyone is invited to St. Vincent Parish at 1:00 p.m.

on Saturday, Feb. 5, for a listening session. After some time in Adoration, we will be organized into small groups and invited to share. The discussion questions can be found on our parish website *Current Events* under "Synod Listening Session." I would love to see a good turnout of St. Charles parishioners.

Over the past few years our parish has made an effort to have more interaction with St. Patrick Parish. We have had their Parish Council for a dinner, a Latino group from St. Patrick came and presented a dramatic presentation of the Passion, and we have taken St. Charles groups to Our Lady of Guadalupe services and Vietnamese New Year celebrations at St. Patrick. Unfortunately, the pandemic has caused us to cancel these exchanges for the past two years. With viral infections spiking, we have declined an invitation to the Vietnamese New Years celebration this weekend. I hope that we will be able to resume sometime soon.

Next week, January 30, marks the beginning of *Catholic Schools Week*. This is a time to recognize the great asset we have in our Catholic schools. We can pray with our students, we can teach the truths of the faith, and we can form our children in Catholic values. We are grateful to the parents, teachers, administrators, staff, and all who are sacrificing to make our Catholic schools strong. We have a lot of reason to be proud of St. Charles Grade School and Bishop Dwenger High School.

Finally, we have finished Week Three of our church renovation project. The progress has been impressive. In the sanctuary, we used to have two steps behind the altar, with the ambo and five chairs on a higher level than the altar. The new design eliminates these steps and the higher floor level, leaving the ambo and chairs on the same level as the altar. All that will remain of the higher floor is a small platform for the tabernacle. A lot of concrete has been removed and soil excavated as the back part of the sanctuary floor is lowered. A photo is attached. The photo was taken standing next to the altar. The priest chairs and slat wall have been removed and we can see the back of our tabernacle, which has not yet been moved. Once the flooring is done and a door is added to the back of the tabernacle, the tabernacle will be moved forward to the cement platform which you see in the photo. It is exciting to see the progress. 3 weeks down and 17 to go!



<u>Your rebates are ready!</u> Credit statements for the last half of 2021 are ready for pickup. This is the money that you earned from

purchasing SCRIP. If you have a student at St. Charles school, your statement went home with your child this past week. If you don't have a student, please pick up your statement at SCRIP sales on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday. Or, you can also stop by the SCRIP office during the week.

What should I do with my SCRIP credit statement? Please treat your statement as you would cash, and we encourage you to use it as soon as possible.

Choose how to spend your money. The funds can be used for more than just tuition at any school. Your earnings can be donated to St. Vincent DePaul, general tuition assistance, capital improvement fund, teacher classroom supplies, vacation bible school, or religious education tuition. In addition, you can apply the money toward the Welcome the Tabernacle campaign or get a Family Rebate Check. The family rebate option is cash back to the customer in the form of a check (must be \$20 or greater).

Don't forget to sign the credit statement. Signatures are required!

Give your completed statement to the SCRIP office.
