A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

This weekend marks the beginning of *Catholic Schools Week* throughout our diocese. We are especially proud of our parish school and the faith that is shared with our children. For those who have never experienced a school Mass, you may want to come sometime and see the reverence of our students. I'm also very edified by the ways

that we have plowed through this pandemic, doing our best to provide a great Catholic education while dealing with the nuisances of sickness, isolations, and quarantines. Through it all, I find a very good spirit in our school. I also serve on the School Board at Bishop Dwenger High School, and I would commend it to anyone. I don't think you could find a better education for a high schooler, and the faith is taught and modeled for our young people. Thank you for your support for our Catholic schools.

Fort Wayne is going to become home for more Afghan refugees than originally expected; I believe that the number has grown from 75 to 150. Catholic Charities has been hard at work organizing English lessons, jobs, housing, schools, and help with the many other needs of these families. Our parish received a note from Catholic Charities thanking us for the help that we have provided. The four-car garage of our parish office has been filled with furnishings on their way to refugee apartments, we have Knights of Columbus helping to move furniture, we have St. Vincent de Paul members organizing donations of clothing and toiletries, and our parish raised \$5,122 in gift cards through the Advent Giving Tree to help these families. Catholic Charities wrote: "Your parish family is truly amazing! Thank you!!"

As a pro-life Church, we are trying to reach out to pregnant women who are in difficult situations and in need of help. The diocese has launched an effort called "Walking with Moms," working with parishes to provide all the help we can. Many will remember that our telephone system was failing us a few months ago. We now have new phones throughout the school, office, church, rectory, and youth house. The system is far more up-to-date and far more reliable. We are grateful to everyone who supported last year's Borromeo Bash for the funds for this important upgrade.

Renovation, Week Four. The large white hanging object which has been above our altar for 46 years, called a *tester*, is no more. It was designed to draw our eyes to the altar below, and it was the home of light fixtures and nine speakers for the sound system. Workers cut down the steel beams and removed it last week. The inside of our church now looks and feels much higher than it did before. [Monsignor Kuzmich used to joke with Monsignor Suelzer that St. Charles church was "lacking in verticality." We now have it!] Four weeks down, sixteen to go.
