

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This is the beginning of Catholic Schools Week. As I look at our parish school, I think that the pandemic has highlighted the value that all of us place on our school. Our teachers have put in a lot of extra work to be sure that remote learning is possible for students who are quarantined. Our maintenance staff has moved furniture, spaced desks, installed new types of water fountains,

and they are on a constant mission of sanitizing. Our Knights of Columbus built plexiglass guards for children who sit at tables. Our cafeteria workers have developed a system for spacing out students in the cafeteria and serving others in their classrooms. Our administrators have worked out dozens of procedures to minimize exposure, to provide livestream Masses, and to work with families when inevitable quarantines are needed. Most of all, I am impressed with our children. They have adapted to masks and spacing and sanitizing with joy. We have a school filled with happy children, learning and praying and playing together. I think that we can be especially proud of what we see this year.

Our parish council has suggested that we begin mailing bulletins to the parishioners who have been missing Mass due to the pandemic. While the bulletin is available on our parish website and through our parish app, many older people don't use that technology. Also, a bulletin arriving in the mail can be a good reminder to people of their connection to the parish; even if they have been away for a long time, this is their home. We are putting a box on the Gathering Space table, asking for names. If you know of someone who has not been attending Mass because of the pandemic and might appreciate receiving a bulletin in the mail, let's make sure we have them on our list.

We have some wonderful ministry happening for our high school youth: boys and girls each meet weekly in discipleship groups with adult leaders for discussion about the faith, prayer, and talk about life. We also have a couple of groups for middle school students, meeting every-other week. Our hope is to expand this and offer it for boys and girls of sixth, seventh and eighth grades. If you would like to learn more or might be interested in helping with this ministry, contact Stacey Huneck, our youth ministry coordinator, youthministry@scbfw.org.

Next weekend we will talk about an Offertory Increase program at the weekend Masses. As we have reported, our offertory donations have dropped around 7% since the pandemic began. While our parish is on sound financial footing, we want to think about this before it turns into a problem. More important, I think it is wise for each of us to look at our own financial picture every now and then and to ask where our priorities lie. When I came to St. Charles four years ago, I signed up to make monthly automatic deposits to the parish from my bank account. Over these past four years, I have had raises in income, but my monthly parish donation has been automatic and I haven't even thought about it. It is good to have a periodic reminder, to take a look, and to decide if our giving is what it should be.

Wednesday is the feast of St. Blaise. We will offer the traditional blessing of throats at the Wednesday Masses and also after the Masses next weekend.






"This Week in RCIA" February 2
