### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

Some words of gratitude are necessary after our February snowstorm. First, we need to thank our maintenance crew for their long hours in clearing snow. They were here all night on Wednesday, most of the day Thursday, and again Friday. In my previous parishes, we hired companies to clear the snow and had to wait as they took care of other customers. It is a blessing to have equipment and dedicated workers able to do the job here at St. Charles.

A thanks too is due to Bob Carroll, our Business Manager. He was here throughout the snow days answering phone calls, copying bulletins, paying bills, and keeping the parish running.

A word on last week's bulletin: due to snow delays, we didn't receive last week's bulletin in time for the weekend. We printed a few hundred on the parish office copier, but underestimated a parish full of sturdy Catholics who show up for Mass even when there is ice in the parking lot. Thankfully, the snow was cleared in time for the event and we had a great turnout, a wonderful meal and a lot of fun together. Matt and Kari Smith have been the driving force behind this event for the past four years and they are stepping down as chairs. We offer thanks especially to them.

Renovation Week Six. Despite two snow days, the progress has been impressive. Most of the terrazzo is poured on the north side of the church, the new back wall is now framed between church and sanctuary, and we are excited to have seven crates of marble delivered from Italy. (See photo.) The marble will be used on the altar, the ambo, and the back wall. Some stalling points: in order to raise the chapel ceiling, heating pipes will have to be moved and the heat will have to be turned off for a couple of days. We are waiting for some warmer days. More troubling, the chemicals needed for the terrazzo floor are still not available.
