A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

We are ready now for Lent. This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, a day of prayer and fasting. Masses will be held at 6:15 a.m., 8:15 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. and at 6:30 p.m. All Masses will be celebrated in the gym. We are marked with ashes as we are reminded that one day we will face death, and we need to turn away from sinfulness

and be ready to meet the Lord. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstaining from meat. All of the Fridays of Lent are also days to abstain from meat.

On Friday evenings during Lent, we will celebrate Mass at 6:30 p.m. in the Church Gathering Space, followed by Stations of the Cross and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, beginning roughly at 7:00 p.m.

Our Lenten enrichment series began a little early and now will continue for the next two Thursday evenings. This Thursday, March 3, Fr. Koehl will speak on Thomas Aquinas' teachings on hope. Next week, March 10, Casey Ryan will give a presentation on Evangelization: Sharing the faith with others. Join us at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center, Door #3.

Lent is a time to take a good look at our lives of faith and to grow closer to the Lord. We need to turn away from sin, work on virtues, focus on our prayer lives, and ask what we can do in acts of service and charity. May this Lent be a fruitful season for all of us.

I would encourage everyone to consider making a reservation for the Revive Mission, which will be held at Bishop Dwenger High School on Wednesday evening, March 9, from 6:30 p.m.-9:00 p.m.. Excellent speakers, music, and adoration time will provide a good Lenten boost for all of us. It is open for all ages and childcare is available for those with little ones. Renovation, Week 8: Parish volunteer carpenters are nearly finished building the cross which will be part of our suspended crucifix, and they are beginning work on building a set of new chairs for the sanctuary. We have learned that the terrazzo floor is labor-intensive. The floor has been poured on the north side of the church. Now it is being ground, sealed and polished. We are still waiting and hoping for enough of the needed chemicals for the sanctuary area and the south side of the church. This week the heat will be turned off for a day or two as heating pipes in the chapel area are relocated, allowing for a higher ceiling above the tabernacle and altar. Attached is a photo of the sanctuary wall, the wall which used to be made of oak slats. The tabernacle will be inserted in this wall, and the wall will be covered in a pattern of marble. 8 weeks down, 12 to go.






In the past 30 years, Croatia has undergone significant change. The end of the communist system was followed by the breakup of the former Yugoslavia, of which Croatia was a part. Today, although Croatia is a member of the European Union, the country's economy still struggles with poverty levels close to 20%, and many young people who are educated have difficulty finding jobs. At the same time, new and vulnerable populations such as seniors, people with disabilities, homeless people, orphans, and refugees bring both material and social needs. The communist legacy in this region destroyed civil society and volunteerism, but young Catholics in Croatia, guided by the Church's social teaching, are being empowered to reengage and make a difference.

The 72 Hours Without Compromise project is organized by the Student Catholic Centre Palma and engages young Croats between the ages of

16 and 30, in ten cities and one municipality, by promoting volunteer service to those on the margins. Project participants come together from Thursday evening through Sunday morning; they richly experience the Church's mission by attending the opening and closing Masses of the weekend and learning and applying Catholic principles of solidarity in service to those in need. In the course of service projects, these young people also learn skills they can then use to secure employment.

Support from the Church in Central and Eastern Europe Collection has helped make 72 Hours Without Compromise a success, extending it beyond the capital city of Zagreb into cities and towns across the country. When you participate in the collection, you help young people such as these participants to put their faith into action, rebuild the fabric of society, and acquire valuable skills that improve their job opportunities.
