All of us are watching developments with the corona virus and wondering how great the threat may become. For now, across the diocese we have eliminated the sharing of Communion under both species. We have also eliminated the shaking of hands at the Sign of Peace. We are explicitly asking that those who are coughing or sneezing, those who are aching and not feeling well, stay home and watch a Mass on T.V. Let me also offer a few ideas which could reduce our exposure to a virus during Holy Communion. For those who receive Communion in the hand, please try to present a flat palm. If the fingers are curled up, it is hard to avoid hand-to-hand contact. Even more important, for those who receive Communion on the



tongue: be aware that there are two situations which sometimes leave a priest or a minister with saliva on the fingers. The first is the person who moves quickly and unexpectedly. The second is the person who doesn't stick the tongue out beyond the lips. I would ask that you be sure that your tongue is protruding beyond your lips and that you do your best to avoid quick movements.

As we sail through Lent, we have entered the time of parish Penance Services. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton has a service Monday evening, St. Vincent is Wednesday evening, and St. John New Haven is Thursday evening. (We will not have our regular Thursday evening confessions at St. Charles so that Fr. James and I can help at St. John.) Our St. Charles service will be next week, on Monday, March 23.

We have a fine Parish Council in our parish, a group which meets monthly to advise the pastor on the spiritual life and the social life of our parish. Members have a three-year term and we are ready to cycle in four new members this spring. The group meets on the first Wednesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. If you would be interested in serving, please contact me at fathertom@scbfw.org. We will have a discernment meeting in May in which we pray over names and ask the Spirit's guidance as we draw them from a basket.


