#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

I write my pastor's column the weekend before the bulletin is distributed. As quickly as things are changing, this column could be totally outdated by the time you read it.

As I write, we are still celebrating Masses in public, but this is now the second of three weekends with the Sunday Mass obligation lifted. We are asking anyone who doesn't feel well to please stay at home and watch the TV Mass instead. Mass is televised weekly in the Fort Wayne area on WFFT TV, FOX Ch. 55 at 10:30 a.m., Sunday morning and on Frontier Ch. 5 and Comcast Ch. 12. We are also encouraging those



who are at-risk for the corona virus to stay home. If you are elderly, have immunity problems or respiratory problems, it would probably be best to avoid coming to church until the scare has passed. In many dioceses of our nation, the Mass is not being celebrated in public at this time.


We have a wide range of precautions in our church, including a regular sanitizing of doors and surfaces. We are not distributing the Precious Blood, we are not sharing a Sign of Peace, we are not passing a collection basket, we are not using hymnals, and we are not having people carry up offertory gifts. All are efforts to avoid passing a virus.

In addition, I am asking people to be very aware of the risks in a Communion line. If you are receiving Communion on the hand, please keep your hands flat, not cupped. If you are receiving on the tongue, please open the mouth wide and extend the tongue and please do not make quick movements.

Our school is closed, our Religious Education program is closed, and most other parish functions are cancelled or postponed. For now, we will not have any school activities, Kingdom Builders, Bible studies on the church campus, or other large gatherings. Unless instructed otherwise, we plan to maintain our current schedule of Masses, confessions, rosaries and Stations.

Our parish penance service was planned for this Monday evening, March 23, that is cancelled. However, both Fr. James and I will be available for confessions from 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. on Monday evening. We are also maintaining our regular confession schedule: Thursday evenings at 7:00 p.m., Saturdays from 2:30 p.m., 4:30 p.m., and on weekday mornings from 7:30 a.m.-8:00 a.m..

I don't know where this virus is leading us, but it is my hope and prayer that it will simply fade away with the coming springtime, as flu viruses seem to do. I have not been able to find a patron saint for flu or other viral diseases, but St. Rocque and St. Sebastian are both known as patron saints for protection against plague. Let's ask them for help.

## ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD MARCH 25

"God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him . . . might have eternal life." (John 3:16) At the Annunciation, God revealed this good news to Mary. She was the first to hear and to believe that God would do what he promised. Her faith told her that nothing is impossible for God. Mary also heard God's invitation calling her to be the Virgin Mother of his Son.


