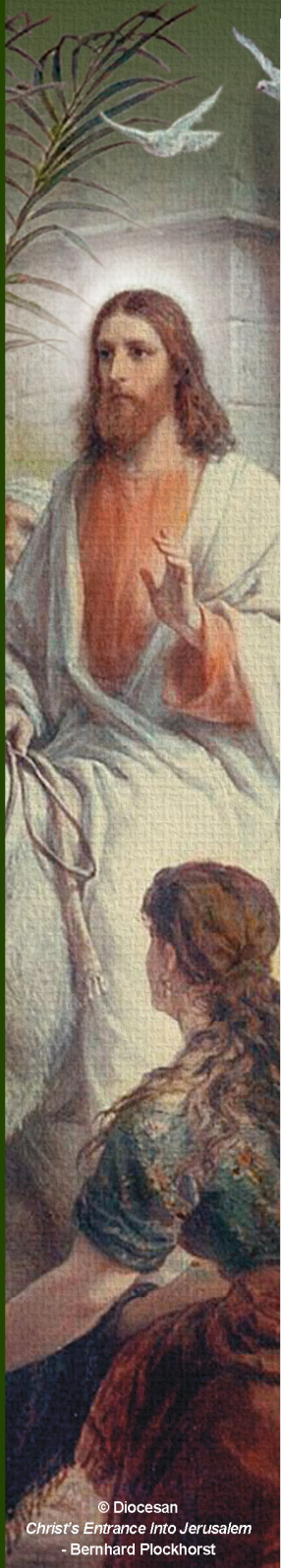

CHRISM MASS AT CATHEDRAL

Everyone is invited to attend the annual *Chrism Mass*, held at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on **Tuesday, April 16, 7:30 p.m.**

At the Chrism Mass, the Holy Chrism is consecrated and the Oil of Catechumens and Oil of the Sick are blessed. This beautiful Mass manifests the communion of the priests with their bishop in the same priesthood and ministry of Christ. An interpreter will be present for those who are hearing impaired.



A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR . . .

We have begun Holy Week. We need to be sure that this is, above all, a week of prayer. You will see that we will have priests available for confessions for roughly 13 hours this week. We will also have our quiet Paschal Watch in the Church from the end of the Holy Thursday Mass until the Easter Vigil begins. You can sign up in the back of Church to spend an hour in the quiet of a dark church.

Our greatest liturgies take place this week. Thursday night at 7:30 p.m. We begin the Sacred Triduum with the **Mass of the Lord's Supper**. We will experience the washing of feet, a procession of the Eucharist and the stripping of the altar. Our **Good Friday Service** begins at 12:30 p.m. in the afternoon. There will be a reading of the Passion according to John, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion. The great **Easter Vigil Mass** begins at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday. We begin outside with our Easter fire and the blessing of the Easter Candle. After the ancient Exsultet is sung in a dark Church, the story of salvation is read, water is blessed and new Catholic Christians will be baptized. This two-hour Mass is the highlight of the Church year. **Easter Masses** are scheduled at 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday, finishing our great Triduum celebration.

On Good Friday, we have a special event this year, as a Latino group from St. Patrick's is coming to present a live dramatic rendering of the Passion. It will be presented at 5:00 p.m. on Good Friday. Traditional Stations of the Cross will be offered on Good Friday as well, at 3:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Please invite friends and relatives to join us and please make this Holy Week the holiest of weeks.

A CALL FOR HELP

The Usher Ministry needs volunteers to fill current openings. Over time, with normal attrition, the number of usher openings has grown to the current state, where we have about 20 openings spread out over most Mass times. We're asking for parishioner help to fill gaps in this important service ministry at St Charles.

The duties are not difficult and, for the most part, are accomplished during the normal Sunday Mass times (e.g. welcoming and seating attendees, offertory collections, guiding attendees during communion, bulletin distribution, etc). We try to place volunteers into their normal Sunday Mass schedules. We encourage families to use this ministry to introduce children to service ministry at the parish. Volunteers serve on usher teams that rotate on a 5 month schedule (i.e. 1 month on with 4 months off). Schedules are flexible when needed absences occur during the assigned month.

Requirements for the indulgence: 1) Make a sincere confession within 20 days before or after the feast day. 2) Receive Holy Communion at a Feast Day Mass. 3) offer prayers for the intention of Pope Francis. 4) Approach this with a complete detachment from sin. Join us for "Tenebrae" - a musical meditation on the seven "last words" of Christ on the Cross - at St. Vincent de Paul Church (1502 E Wallen Rd) on **Good Friday, April 19**, at 9:00 p.m. Tenebrae is the Latin word for "darkness." The gradual extinguishing of all candles in the church symbolizes the temporary triumph of the prince of darkness over the Light of the World. The loud noise, or strepitus, at the conclusion of the service suggests the earthquake described in the Passion narratives. The single candle left burning, the Paschal candle, is the symbol and promise of Christ's triumph over death and darkness.
