A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

The Covid pandemic is hopefully winding down, but it is not over yet. We have parishioners who have reason to be afraid of crowds, and we need to be considerate of them. While we are loosening some of the restrictions in our diocese, Bishop Rhoades has asked us to spread a reminder that we are still asked to wear masks at Mass.

This Sunday is a World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We are praying that more young men and women from our parish will answer the call to priesthood and religious life. We have received word that a seminarian will be assigned at St. Charles for the summer. LeeAllen Fortin will join us the weekend of May 22. LeeAllen is a familiar face around town; he used to belong to the Franciscan Friars. We are blessed that he is now studying for priesthood in our diocese.

May 1 is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Like St. Joseph, most of us work to support ourselves and our families, to help support our Church, and to serve others. For most of us, our work is very much a part of our vocation in life.

Our parish Knights of Columbus have taken on many different service projects over the past year, and they recently won an award from the state organization for best service project. Last summer they constructed acrylic shields for student desks so that our parish school could begin the year with an extra degree of safety. We are proud of all of the good works carried out by our Knights.

Next weekend is First Communion weekend. In order to accommodate all of our guests and still have safe spacing in the church, we will have two First Communion Masses on Sunday afternoon, one at 1:00 p.m. and another at 3:00 p.m. We are excited for our children.

On a personal note: On Friday I will be in Lafayette, attending the funeral of my uncle, who died at age 95. Uncle Gordon was my godfather. At a baptism, godparents promise to be good examples for a child, living an active faith life in the Church. My godfather was very active in his parish, attending daily Mass and Bible studies. His faith was easy to see. May all of us who are godparents take that role seriously.



WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS



The purpose of *World Day of Prayer for Vocations, April 25, 2021,* is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38; Lk 10:2). As a climax to a prayer that is continually offered throughout the Church, it affirms the primacy of faith

and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms (male and female religious life, societies of apostolic life, consecrated virginity), secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life.

- † Encourage your children, grandchildren, or other young people to consider a vocation as a priest or religious brother or sister.




