## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

As I look at my calendar, I see that this is First Communion weekend. What a sad state of affairs. When we sent our children home in March, they weren't yet fully prepared for the sacrament. Now, we are not allowed to gather for this great day. When we are able to gather again safely and when our children are fully ready, we will have a



great celebration. Only the Lord knows now when that will be.

We are also missing our May procession and crowning this weekend. For those with a statue of the Blessed Mother in your home, it may be time to begin a tradition of crowning that statue while praying a family rosary and singing a hymn to Mary in your home. We are planning to do a private May crowning in the church and film it for this week's Fireside Chat. If you haven't found your way yet to our parish Fireside Chats, they are posted on the parish website along with the pastor's column. You can also go to Youtube.com and type in "St. Charles fireside chat."

We had a wonderful parish event last weekend, planned at the very last minute yet carried out with great reverence. I opened an e-mail from Margaret Ryan on the morning of April 25, asking about the *Greater Litanies*. I had never heard of this. With a little internet research, I learned that there is a tradition dating back to the 7<sup>th</sup> century of holding a procession on April 25, praying for mercy and asking for relief in times of crisis. The tradition says that St. Peter moved to Rome on April 25 and that would be the date when the Roman Catholic Church became Roman. It is recorded that twice the plague was ended in Europe after people took part in these processions and begged the Lord's mercy.

As I looked at these accounts, my eyes popped when I read that St. Charles Borromeo was an active participant in the Greater Litanies. It seems that when he moved to his diocese of Milan, he was disappointed that so few people were taking part. Therefore, he led the procession himself, walking through the streets of Milan barefoot as an act of penance.

Given all of that history, it seemed clear that we needed to do this. Six or seven families were quickly gathered outside the church and we held a procession with the Blessed Sacrament. Maintaining six feet of social distance, we processed around the church property, reciting litanies of mercy and praying a litany of the saints. Following the example of our patron saint, many of us walked the procession barefoot as an act of penance. A beautiful event, asking for God's mercy in this time of crisis. Next year, assuming that we won't be so isolated, we may want to organize this and announce it in advance.

I would hope that every St. Charles parishioners is actively taking part in a TV Mass or a livestreamed internet Mass. This is our time for God, a time that we need. One family told me that they dress up in Sunday clothes and light candles by the TV. Another parishioner told me that her family is enjoying attending Mass in a variety of churches across the country and even in foreign countries.
