A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost. Our God is not remote, but here with us. We would love to sing our finest Alleluias, including the triple Alleluia that normally ends a Pentecost Mass. However, during this pandemic, we are taking every



precaution not to spread droplets of saliva, and thus we are not singing. Please sing on your way to and from church.

A year from now, when this pandemic is behind us, we will have a much better idea of how we should have reacted. For now, medical personnel, government officials, Church leaders, and parishes are all making our best guesses of how to avoid spreading a deadly disease without totally disrupting life. The precautions we are taking in church may seem overbearing. However, with a deadly disease in our midst, we need to err on the side of caution. I thank you for your patience and cooperation. These efforts are acts of charity, doing all that we can to avoid spreading sickness to others

Last weekend was our first weekend with public Masses since the pandemic began. We had no idea how many people to expect and we prepared for overflow Masses in the gym in order to spread people at safe distances. With the Mass obligation lifted and with at-risk people strongly encouraged to stay home, my estimate is that we had roughly 25% of our normal attendance. We had plenty of space in the church and there was no need for overflow Masses. My prayer is that the medical community will develop more solutions, the disease will wane, and our Mass attendance will climb. For now, we still encourage everyone to use good judgment. For those at risk, a livestream Mass at home is safest.

We have an annual collection in our diocese on Pentecost Sunday to help cover the tuition costs of our seminarians. Typically, a seminarian would be asked to speak at Mass to promote that collection. This year, the bishop thinks that we are better simply getting back on our feet and not featuring a speaker at Mass to talk about a collection. That said, this is a very important collection. We have been very blessed with a growing number of seminarians in our diocese, but we are faced with very high tuition costs. Please be as generous as you can. This is an investment in the future of our Church.

ORDINATION TO THE PRIESTHOOD AND DIACONATE

With praise and thanksgiving, Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades will ordain Rev. Mr. Stephen Felicichia to the priesthood and Michael Ammer, Paolo Degasperi, Benjamin Landrigan, Keeton Lockwood, Augustine Onuoha and Logan Parrish to the diaconate through the imposition of hands and the invocation of the Holy Spirit.

The ordination Mass is a ticketed private event on Saturday, June 6, at 11 a.m. at St. Vincent de Paul Church, Fort Wayne. The event will be livestreamed for the general public on the diocesan website at diocesefwsb.org, and on YouTube and Facebook, search @diocesefwsb. Redeemer Radio will also broadcast live on 106.3 FM (Fort Wayne).

SCRIP NEWS



scrip in the "New Normal" – It was good to see our friends again at church last weekend. It was also good to see that many people chose to take advantage of the live streaming of the services in order to keep themselves and others safe. The question of the day was, "when can we buy SCRIP?"

SO, <u>HOW</u> and <u>WHEN</u> can you purchase <u>SCRIP</u>?

Someone is usually in the SCRIP Office Monday – Thursday, 8:30 a.m. until noon and on Fridays following sales in the Hession Center (typically 9:35 am) until noon. **969-4027.**

- The easiest way to get SCRIP is to call the SCRIP Office anytime and leave your order on the answering machine. The next time we are in the office, we will fill your order and it can be picked up and paid for at the Parish Office. They are open Monday Friday, 8:30 a.m. 4:30 p.m. It is best to leave a phone number so we can call and let you know that your order is ready or in case we have any questions.
- If you prefer to speak with us, <u>call in the morning during our</u>
 <u>office hours</u> and your order should be ready after noon that same day.
- <u>Friday morning sales in the Hession Center 8:30 a.m. –</u>
 9:30 a.m. resumed on May 22.
- We will be available on weekends during our normal times, after the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Sat. and between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Sunday. We do ask that you continue to wear the mask that you are wearing to enter church and maintain 6 feet of distance between yourself and others at all times. For your convenience and to avoid lines, we have a few additional options:

Call the SCRIP office to place your order before noon on Friday and ask for <u>pick-up</u> at church that weekend.

When you arrive at church, place your SCRIP order in the clearly marked <u>drop box</u> outside the SCRIP Room in the Gathering Space. This option is available before the Sat. evening 5:00 p.m. Mass or the Sunday Masses at 7:30 a.m. or 9:00 a.m. Your order will be filled while you are in church and you can <u>pick it up before you leave</u>.

Visit the SCRIP sales table. (Our procedure has been modified to comply with the SOCIAL DISTANCING Guidelines.)

Being Good Stewards – Knowing what to have in our inventory is always something of a guessing game. It has been even harder during this uncertain time. That means some items may not always be available. We encourage you to plan ahead and we will do our best to accommodate you. Remember, we order our new inventory on Mondays at 9 am. Call before then for "must have" items. If we don't have it when you call, we will have it by Thursday, noon.

To Our Volunteers – We will be in contact with you to let you know if you are needed on your scheduled week.
