The Gospel today is sometimes called "the Gospel in miniature" because it so concisely sums up the Gospel message. In even more condensed form, "God loved...God gave..." it is the paradigm for stewardship—we give because we love.

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

May I share some thoughts as a priest/dentist? We have instituted many efforts to avoid spreading a virus: masks, distancing, sanitizing surfaces, and Masses without singing. I think that our weakest point is in sharing Holy Communion. That necessitates close contact.



You will note that I stop to sanitize my hands after serving anyone on the tongue. Even when there is no contact, when I am close enough to an open mouth to place a Host on a tongue, I can often feel warm breath on my fingers. That warm breath contains saliva droplets. This is the reason that we recommend receiving on the hand until the pandemic ends.

At the bishop's direction, we will continue to serve Holy Communion on the tongue to those for whom it is important act of piety. I ask that you come forward in the priest's line at the center aisle and I ask for patience and understanding as I sanitize my hands. I would also prefer that you wait until the end of the Communion line, minimizing the number of people behind you.

For those who receive Communion on the hand, we also need to do our best to avoid skin contact. Please hold your hands out flat, without curling the fingers and without closing your hand once the Host is placed on your palm.

All of us wait in hope for the day that this pandemic is past and we can focus on God's great gift without the ugly distractions of safety issues.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH

During this time of the pandemic, I have had the time to learn several new organ pieces or re-learn some from the past. I thought I would share bits and pieces about them in upcoming bulletins.

Several parishioners asked me about the title of the prelude piece played at the 5 PM, 7:30 & 9:00 AM Masses on May 23-24.

It was the, "Phoenix Processional" by Dan Locklair. Dan is Composer-in-Residence and Professor of Music at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. I first learned this piece several years ago from Dr. Marilyn Keiser of Indiana University, who played a recital here at St. Charles in 2012. It is a grand, triumphant piece which I felt was not only appropriate for The Feast of the Ascension but, for our first weekend back of having in-person Masses. The Phoenix symbolizes rebirth, renewal, and beginning of new life.
