Today really is Father's Day and if you are still looking for something to show the Fathers in your life how special they are, stop by the SCRIP sales table and check out what we have in gift cards. They make the perfect gift.

Welcome Back! – Last week we saw a significant number of parishioners return for live Mass and we filled a nice number of **SCRIP** orders as well. It was wonderful to see so many of you. It's important to remember to wear face masks, wash hands and be respectful of social distancing. Science is proving that these steps make a difference. While you might find it annoying, it might mean the difference in saving a life.



SCHEDULE NOTE – Mark your calendars for the following schedule changes. In observance of the 4th of July, there are no SCRIP sales July 3 – July 5. Friday morning sales in the Hession Center will take place on Thursday, July 2, and the office will be open again on Monday, July 6.

Plan Ahead – In these uncertain times, we feel it is important to be prudent with the funds invested in the **SCRIP** program by carrying a slightly smaller inventory. This simply means that for some items you might have to wait about a week. We order on



Mondays and the inventory is typically in by noon the following Thursday. This is not a problem if you simply plan ahead.

SCRIP Credits are Ready! – The SCRIP credit reports for the first half of 2020 are ready and can be picked up at your convenience.



Remember, you can call the **SCRIP** office anytime. If we don't answer, leave your order on the answering machine. We will fill your order and you can pick it up at the Parish Office. The **SCRIP** team is back on Friday mornings and on the weekends during our regular times for your convenience. **969-4027**.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH

GERMAN AND FRENCH ORGAN MUSIC

Since early June is normally Germanfest in Fort Wayne, I recently presented some German organ pieces for our 5:00 p.m., 7:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. Masses. In celebration of Trinity Sunday on June 6-7, I played three organ settings of the Trinitarian hymn, "All Glory Be to God on High," by the composers, Johann Walther, Friederich Zachau, and Andreas Vetter. All three composers wrote a wealth of music during the Baroque period in Germany around the same time as Johann Sebastian Bach, one of the greatest organ composers of all time.

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, J. S. Bach's setting of the Eucharistic Hymn, I played "Soul, Adorn Yourself With Gladness." This meditative piece, nearly ten minutes in length, is a part of Bach's "Great Eighteen" chorale preludes composed during the final decade of his life, 1740 -1750. The text of the first stanza of the hymn is as follows:

Soul, adorn yourself with gladness, Leave the gloomy haunts of sadness, Come into the daylight's splendor, There with joy your praises render. Bless the One whose grace unbounded Has this wondrous banquet founded; He, though heavenly, high, and holy, Deigns to dwell with you most holy.

Also on the Feast of Corpus Christi, during the receiving of Holy Communion, I played the "Elevation" from the Mass for the Convents by the French composer, Francois Couperin. Couperin also lived during the Baroque period and, among his many keyboard works, composed two "Masses" specifically for the organ, "Mass for the Convents" and "Mass for the Parishes." Each section of these was to be played during specific parts of the Mass, with the "Elevation" to be played during the elevation of The Host and receiving of the Body and Blood of Christ.

I hope your prayers were lifted high as these pieces were played during Mass.
