A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR . . .

There is a lot of news around the parish this week. First, our electronic signs are installed. You'll see that the black lettering on the brick bases matches the lettering over the church door. We are having some training sessions this week to learn how to program messages. We'll do our best to keep current in announcing events and in inviting neighbors to join us.

You will also find new oak pews in the chapel. These pews have quite a history. They came from the chapel at the Victory Noll convent in Huntington, which was dedicated in 1925. For almost 100 years, sisters have

been praying on these pews! The sisters offered us the pews last summer and the Knights of Columbus transported them. When they arrived, I was excited to see that they were solid oak, with no plywood or veneer... however, the finish had turned nearly black and didn't match our chapel at all. Mike Freygang convinced me that stripping the pews would be worth the time and effort. With the help of Tim and Mary Beth Becker at Five Acre Mill, Tom Lothamer, and Bob Current, an enormous amount of labor went into refinishing, lengthening, replacing moldings, rebuilding the kneelers, and adding racks for hymnals. Exchanging the chapel chairs for these pews, we are gaining seating, making it easier to sing in the chapel, and offering kneelers which are far more stable than the hinged kneelers on the back of the chairs.

Thirdly, I point to our brand-new website, www.stcharlesfortwayne.org. One of my favorite aspects of this site: from the menu, if you click on sacraments and then funerals, you will find most everything you need to organize and plan a funeral. Many questions are answered and there are clicks provided to look at the options for funeral readings and music. I think that many families who are dealing with death will find this a useful site.

STATEMENT ON IMMIGRATION ISSUES FROM BISHOP KEVIN RHOADES

Recent developments in our government's treatment of immigrants seeking safety and security in our country are very disturbing. The unnecessary separation of children from their parents is immoral, uncompassionate, and harmful to children. In addition, I strongly disagree with the Attorney General's decision not to allow asylum for those seeking protection from domestic or gang violence. Throughout our nation's history, such protection has saved many lives and demonstrated our nation's compassion for the vulnerable and persecuted. I encourage all to contact our elected representatives to urge them to enact legislation to end the unjust and inhumane separation of migrant children from their parents, to reopen asylum protection for those fleeing domestic and gang violence, and also to protect the 1.8 million "Dreamers" living in our country.

While the Catholic Church recognizes and respects the right of every nation to regulate its borders, this right must be balanced with the rights of vulnerable migrants to access protection and with the fundamental right of all to life and dignity as human persons; as well as the rights of parents and the family, the cradle of life and love, the first and vital cell of society. I particularly ask the Catholic faithful to remember Jesus, Mary, and Joseph — the Holy Family — who were compelled to leave their land and migrate to Egypt. Let us pray to the Holy Family for migrant families today, compelled to leave their homelands because of violence, extreme poverty, or persecution, who are exposed to grave danger. May the Lord protect them and may the Lord inspire our nation to exercise justice and compassion.

SCRIP Credit Reports – The SCRIP credit reports for the first half of 2018 are ready for pick-up. We still have a significant number of reports from the end of 2017 as well. Please pick up your credit statement at the SCRIP sales table at your earliest convenience. If you want your credit to be sent to Dwenger in time for verification day, it must be returned to us no later than Monday, July 16.

SCRIP Tip – If you have a child who is in need of orthodontic treatment, we have several orthodontists that participate in the SCRIP program. Dr. Dellinger, Dr. Hoagburg, Dr. Parrish and Dr. Bussick each offer a rebate to SCRIP based on the services being rendered. However, you must pick up a form from the SCRIP office to present to the dentist before treatment begins, they will not offer the rebate retroactively. Our parishioner, *Dr. Todd Briscoe*, supports our SCRIP program with a quarterly rebate for each parishioner who is a patient. *Dr. Mark Stoner* also offers a rebate for services. Just one more way to take advantage of the "free money" that SCRIP makes possible.
