

#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

The Fourth of July falls on Monday this week. It is our time as a nation to stop and remember the gifts that God has given us, and also to remember the freedoms and liberties won for us through the sacrifices of others. We sometimes focus on all of the problems in our nation, but I think that most of us would agree that there are

few places on earth we would choose over this nation. We are a nation of immigrants and nearly all of us have ancestors who left their homes and came here because of the opportunities and the freedoms they saw here. We have one Mass on Monday, at 8:15.

We are making plans to add a full-time staff member in the parish. Stacey Huneck's official title is Youth Ministry Coordinator, but her job has been expanding over the past few years and we have seen exciting things happening. In addition to a very active High School Ministry, Stacey is now overseeing Middle School Ministry and Young Adult Ministry. In addition, Stacey has been coordinating the parish Facebook page and social media and she has been helping with many diocesan events for young adults. It is vital that we nourish the faith of our young people, and these ministries are priorities in the parish. Adding a staff person to work with Stacey, our hope is that we can expand these ministries. We are now offering regular retreats for our youth and for young adults; with enough staffing, we hope to also be able to organize adult retreats as well.

Last week's Supreme Court decision, striking down Roe versus Wade, has aroused a lot of passion in our nation. I think that the Catholic Church has been the most high-profile voice in our nation speaking out for the beauty and dignity of an unborn child. No matter the difficult circumstances of a pregnancy, taking the life of a child is a tragic choice. While we continue to defend unborn children, the Catholic Church also needs to be a strong and highprofile defender of those who find themselves faced with a crisis pregnancy. We need to support Women's Care Center, A Mother's Hope, and other agencies which help young mothers in troubling times. We have also begun a new initiative in our parish called "Walking with Moms in Need." Our goal is that anyone in a difficult situation revolving around a pregnancy can call on the parish and we can be here to help. When we see a girl or a young woman making self-sacrifices for the good of a baby, I think that we see a hero. That mom deserves our admiration and any help we can offer.




