A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

School seems to begin earlier every year. Our school opens on August 8, just a week and a half away. Our enrollment numbers are good, but we do still have a few open spaces in most grades. If you or someone you know may be interested in enrolling in our parish school, call right away. Depending on income levels and simple eligibility requirements, many students are eligible for Indiana Choice Scholarships.


This Friday is Portiuncula Day, a day celebrating the life of St. Francis of Assisi. The Portiuncula was one of two tiny chapels outside of Assisi which St. Francis found in ruins and rebuilt. It was in this

chapel that the Franciscan order began and also that St. Clare took her vows, the beginning of the Poor Clare Community. In Francis' time, as the order grew, large numbers of Franciscans built straw huts around the chapel, where they slept. It was in one of those huts next to the chapel that St. Francis died.

Beginning in medieval times, a plenary indulgence was offered to pilgrims who visited the Portiuncula on August 2. That indulgence was expanded to anyone who attends Mass and receives Communion in a parish church on this day. To receive the indulgence, one must go to Confession, offer prayers for the pope, and have a detachment from sin. We will celebrate the day here at St. Charles with an extra Mass at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, and Confessions heard from 3:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m. by several priests. Local secular Franciscans are organizing food, games for children, and religious items for sale from 3:30 p.m.-7:30 p.m. in the school cafeteria.

(Note: We will have our regular Friday evening Holy Hour at 7:00 p.m. that evening, in the church.)

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH


Several parishioners have asked recently about my 16 day trip to the UK so, I thought I'd share a very condensed synopsis here.

I was privileged to be on a nine-day tour with the Chancel Choir of Trinity English Lutheran Church here in Fort Wayne where we sang in several great Cathedrals including Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin, Ireland; Liverpool (England) Cathedral; and Southwark Cathedral in London. We also visited two other famous Cathedrals, York Minster in York, England; and St. Paul's Cathedral in London where we attended choral evensong in both venues. We were also able to visit many other historical sites along the way including Kilkenny, Ireland with its famous castle, and the scholarly city of Oxford, England.

Following the choir tour, I traveled by train from London to Edinburgh, Scotland for seven days where I visited the famed Edinburgh Castle; heard the famous choir of men and trebles at St. Mary's Cathedral; and attended a candlelight concert of Vivaldi's, "The Four Seasons" at St. Giles Cathedral. I also visited the city of Glasgow; the ancient Cathedral ruins and university at St. Andrew's; took a boat cruise on Loch Lomond, the largest lake in Scotland; and visited the quaint village and castle at Linlithgow.

It was a fantastic trip and, most of all, I heard some outstanding and inspiring choral and organ music in many beautiful places. The Irish, the Brits, and the Scots certainly know how to do it right and it was an honor to be a part of it. If you haven't been to these countries, I urge you to go. There are so many things to see and do and you won't be disappointed!
