A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

The latest news concerning Mass obligations came out on Tuesday morning:

"While commending our pastors and pastoral life coordinators who have gone to great lengths to assure safe worship spaces in our churches, due to the increase in the COVID-19 cases in our state, the Indiana Bishops have decided to extend

the dispensation from the obligation of Sunday Mass attendance beyond August 15 until November 1, 2020, unless further developments determine otherwise."

For those who are infirmed or in danger of being in public, we will continue our livestream 11:00 Mass on Sundays.

Apologies to those who tuned in for our livestream Mass last weekend. Unknown to us, our computers upgraded a program on the weekend, and we were left without sound for the first 27 minutes of the Mass. Those who can read lips surely enjoyed one of my best homilies ever. For those who gave up, you'll just have to take my word for it.

This Saturday is August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. While this is typically a holy day of obligation, there is no obligation this year. We will have three Masses for the Assumption: a vigil Mass on Friday evening at 6:30 p.m. and 8:15 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning, and the Saturday evening 5:00 p.m. Mass will also be the Mass of the Assumption. While there is no obligation, this is an important feast. Our eyes are set on heaven as we see Mary there already, body and soul.

School opens on Tuesday this week. With all of the planning and precautions caused by the pandemic, things won't look the same as usual. We thank our teachers, administrators and maintenance crew for all of the work they have put into the preparations. We are anxious to see our children again!

Friday will be our first 8:15 a.m. school Mass. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, the social distancing that is now required is going to change the look of that Mass. We can only seat two grades in the church at a time, and we will need to reserve all of the pews in the church to allow students to spread out adequately. We will set out chairs around the perimeter of the church for adults. I thank everyone for your understanding and patience as we try to navigate this pandemic and also try to provide sacraments. For those adults who worry about being around so many children or who don't like to sit in a chair in the back of church, the 6:15 a.m. Mass or the 6:30 p.m. Mass may be better






Help Is Needed at the Homeless Shelter **Just Neighbors**


