

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Good news. We now have the three approvals needed from the diocese to push ahead with our church renovation plans. The Architecture Committee, the Finance Committee and the Building Committee have all given their endorsements. We are contracting Schenkel Construction Company to begin construction just

after Christmas. The church will be shut down for some months while construction takes place and we will use the gym for weekend Masses and school Masses. We plan to set up an altar and chairs in the Gathering Space for our other daily Masses during the construction period. Our hope is that we will be back in a beautiful, renovated church in time for Easter.

In the coming weeks, you will be hearing about the capital campaign which accompanies the renovation. The campaign is titled "Welcoming the Tabernacle" because we want to focus on the most important motivation for our renovation: bringing the tabernacle into our church. While the renovation cost should be around \$1.6 million, we are including the Annual Bishop's Appeal in this campaign and thus we are setting a goal of \$1.8 million. We have some very generous gifts already and we are on the way. As the campaign draws near, one thing to keep in mind: since we won't be asking for a gift for the Bishop's Appeal this year, your usual gift to that appeal can be a starting point for a gift to the campaign.

It has been good to have Jake Schneider, Sam Martinez and Noah Isch, our parish seminarians, coming and going this summer. Now all three have returned to school. If my calculations are correct, Jake has two years of seminary left. Both Sam and Noah have five years to go. We would love to see more young men and women from St. Charles hear and respond if the Lord calls them to priesthood or religious life. A reminder: LeeAllen Fortin will be ordained a deacon on September 4, at 11:00 a.m. at the Cathedral. Everyone is welcome.

The Knights of Columbus are holding their "Men's Toys and Tools" Garage Sale next weekend in the parish office garage. They have an interesting array of things that would appeal to men. 

app on your phone that allows you to purchase e-gift cards and have them delivered to your virtual wallet in only a few minutes. Depending on the retailer, the e-cards can be used online or shown at checkout in-store. Once you setup your online account, you might also consider purchasing a reloadable gift card from the SCRIP office. Over 140 gift cards are available where you can transfer funds directly to your reloadable gift card. Using the RaiseRight app requires a linked bank account and a special St. Charles code, so contact a SCRIP coordinator to get all the details.
