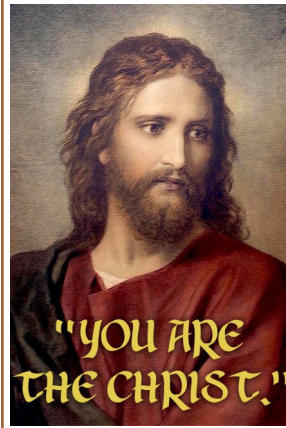

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We are showing a video before Masses this weekend, explaining the renovation project ahead of us. Keith Heimann, one of our renovation committee members, will offer some words about the project and the capital campaign which will accompany it. We hope to raise \$1.8 million, covering the cost of the renovation and also covering our goal in this year's Annual Bishop's Appeal. (Our parish will not ask for money for the Bishop's Appeal this year. As you think about the renovation campaign, you will want to begin with the amount you would usually give to the Bishop's Appeal and then decide on a pledge for the renovation.) Pledge cards will be passed out two weeks from now.

I received a letter this week from Austin Roy, our parishioner who has joined a Carthusian community in Vermont. He is now a postulant with the order, and with his first year ending, should soon become a novice. He reports that seven young men have joined the monastery in the past two years. The Carthusians are among the strictest of monastic orders. Theirs is a life of quiet and solitude and the monks rarely speak, even to one another. Each monk lives in a secluded cell with an attached walled garden. These gardens must be pretty large; Austin reports that he has two apple trees, a pear tree, four pine trees and three blueberry bushes in his garden. As we remember Austin in prayer, we pray for more vocations to the religious life.

Catholic Relief Service is the agency of the US Catholic Church which helps people in third-world countries who are living in poverty. It is an amazing organization and has done amazing works. We would like to find a few volunteers from our parish who would be our parish liaisons. After attending an organizational meeting on the evening of September 30, they would bring information to the parish and help us as a parish to find ways to address third-world poverty. 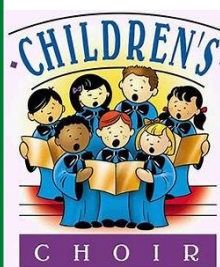
