2023 Annual Bishop's Appeal

Frequently Asked Questions:

- 1. What is the Annual Bishop's Appeal? The Annual Bishop's Appeal is an important annual fund for the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. The donations received help fund various ministries, programs and services.
- 2. What is the best way to give? Giving online at diocesefwsb.org/aba is a more secure method and also saves processing time for parish and diocesan staff. You can also scan this QR code to give online. If giving online, please do not submit a pledge card, as this creates a duplicate pledge.



- 3. What if I cannot give at this time? Please still send in your pledge card marking it with a zero. A completed pledge card will save parish follow-up letters and telephone calls.
- 4. <u>How do I return my pledge card?</u> You can mail your pledge card in the return envelope provided, drop it in the offertory collection basket at Mass, or drop off at the parish office.
- 5. **How do I make payments on my pledge?** Monthly statements/reminders will be sent out by the Diocesan Business Office for 10 months, December to September. All checks should be made out to the "Annual Bishop's Appeal" and returned to the diocese in the return envelope provided, not to the parish.
- 6. What if our parish reaches its goal? Any money collected in excess of our goal will be returned to the Parish to use as needed.
