

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR.

With a goal of \$1.8 million, we have passed the million dollar mark and I counted 75 pledge envelopes, not yet opened, in last weekend's collection baskets. If you have not yet made a pledge, we would love to hear from you.

The Knights of Columbus held their blood drive on October 9, and they have their Fish Fry this Friday, Oct. 15, from 4:30 to 7 p.m. Our Knights are one busy group of men!
