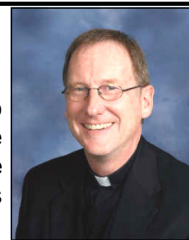

I am in Indianapolis this weekend for a niece's wedding. I'll be back Sunday evening.

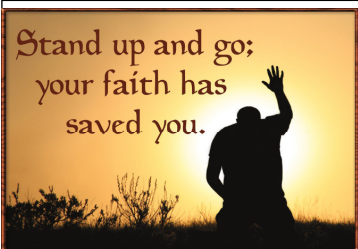

A LETTER FROM THE BISHOP

October 13, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis has asked that the whole Church revive her missionary awareness and commitment during the month of October this year. The theme of this missionary month is *Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World*. During this month we will also celebrate World Mission Sunday, and Pope Francis reflected on this theme during his message to mark this special month earlier this year:

“Celebrating this month will help us first to rediscover the missionary dimension of our faith in Jesus Christ, a faith graciously bestowed on us in baptism. Our filial relationship with God is not something simply private, but always in relation to the Church. Through our communion with God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we, together with so many of our other brothers and sisters, are born to new life....We received this gift freely and we share it freely (cf. Mt 10:8), without excluding anyone. God wills that all people be saved by coming to know the truth and experiencing his mercy through the ministry of the Church, the universal sacrament of salvation.(cf. 1 Tm 2:4; Lumen Gentius, 48)

While we are all called through our baptism to become missionary disciples who spread the Good News of Jesus Christ among our families, friends, neighbors and co-workers, next weekend, October 19 and 20, we will have a concrete opportunity to support the mission work of the Church throughout the world through the annual collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This collection benefits more than 1,100 dioceses in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific, an area that covers more than half the territory of the globe. I ask you to be as generous as possible with this collection so that the Church may continue to proclaim Christ to the ends of the earth.

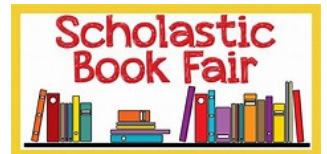
