I'm hearing great reviews from the folks who are currently in the parish *Alpha* program. We have 80 people doing this 10-week series, enjoying dinner together, watching excellent videos, and getting to know one another with great faith sharing. We will run the Alpha program again in the winter, including child care for those with young children.

Several people have asked about Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with times for Adoration in our parish. We probably need to raise awareness of the opportunities now at hand. We have Adoration at St. Charles every Friday evening from 7:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. We also expose the Blessed Sacrament from 9:00 a.m.-2:15 p.m. on three days during the school year (Nov. 6, this year, Jan. 31 and May 15, 2019), and we have






Technology & Teens Parent Workshop


Parents, join us on October 28, from 6:15 p.m.-7:45 p.m. in the Church. This workshop will explore the way that smartphones

DID YOU KNOW???

St Charles' Knights of Columbus Council 451 – is 119 years old!

Founded in October 1899 – Council 451 was the first K of C Council in Ft Wayne/ Northeast Indiana. Started by 36 forward-thinking Catholic men, "451" was the only Knights Council in the area for many years. In June, 2015, Council 451 became the Knight's Council of St. Charles Borromeo.

FOUNDER'S DAY – On Sunday, October 28, at 10:30 AM, (PROPER TITLE LANGUAGE - Bishop Kevin Rhoades), a member of Council 451, will celebrate the memory of these men in the Catholic Cemetery, where 29 of the 36 Founders rest today. Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next weekend we will celebrate World Mission Sunday, a day on which we recall and recommit ourselves to our mission as baptized believers to bring Christ and his Church to the ends of the earth. As Pope Francis reflected in his message for World Mission Sunday this year:

"Human, cultural and religious settings still foreign to the Gospel of Jesus and to the sacramental presence of the Church represent the extreme peripheries, the 'ends of the earth', to which, ever since the first Easter, Jesus' missionary disciples have been sent, with the certainty that their Lord is always with them (cf. Mt 28:20; Acts 1:8). This is what we call the missio ad gentes. The most desolate periphery of all is where mankind, in need of Christ, remains indifferent to the faith or shows hatred for the fullness of life in God. All material and spiritual poverty, every form of discrimination against our brothers and sisters, is always a consequence of the rejection of God and his love."

Next weekend, October 20 and 21, we will have a concrete opportunity to support this missionary work of the Church through the annual collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This collection benefits more than 1,100 dioceses in Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific, an area that covers more than half the territory of the globe. I ask you to be as generous as possible with this collection so that the Church may continue to proclaim Christ and the new life in Him that is the source of our joy.

They assure us that the old number will continue to be associated with St. Charles but if you are newly enrolling you will need to search for either St. Charles Borromeo - Fort Wayne or the new number, PQ921.
