

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR.

I will be away on retreat this week from Wednesday through Sunday. I'm going to the Jesuit Retreat House near Cincinnati. You will be in good hands with Fr. James and Fr. Koehl.

I have been excited to see all of the work our volunteers have done on the church pews. After pulling out tens of thousands of staples, they are

now patching, staining and finishing. They are also working underneath the pews, trying to remove staples and make sure that we don't have sharp edges. We are grateful for all of the labor.

Our Knights of Columbus have their annual membership drive next weekend. This is a wonderful organization for Catholic men, and I have never seen a group take on as many projects as our Knights have. Last week they sponsored a very successful blood drive and they are doing most of the work on the pew finishing. This weekend they have the parish fish fry and they are working on a church landscaping project. Next weekend, they will sponsor coffee and donuts for the parish. All the while they are collecting and crushing aluminum cans and offering their services outside of the parish, too. The organization is not just focused on labor; they have social events and spiritual events as well. I would encourage all of our Catholic men to consider joining the Knights.

Sister Genevieve Raupp is celebrating this year her Golden Anniversary with the Franciscan Sisters of the Sacred Heart. She has spent the majority of her fifty years serving in our school—as teacher, principal, and now assistant principal. The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on <u>Monday, October 18</u>, at 7:00 p.m. in the <u>Hession Center, Room B.</u> Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. During the month of August we were able to help 39 individuals consisting of 30 adults and 9 children. We provided \$1,197.60 in rent, \$2,278.25 in utility payments, \$42.00 for medical bills, \$300.00 for miscellaneous items and \$138.25 for food which provided 727 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family for a total of \$4,156.10 to help the needy. Your generous support makes this possible. Thank you!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Next weekend, in union with the whole Church, we will celebrate World Mission Sunday. This observance was instituted to remind Catholics about their commitment to support the missionary work of the Church through prayer and sacrifice. This call has intensified in the past year because of the serious difficulties which so many people are experiencing due to the pandemic. Pope Francis reflected on the theme of this year's collection, "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard," in his message for World Mission Sunday earlier this year:

"Like the Apostles and the first Christians, we too can say with complete conviction: 'We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard' (Acts 4:20). Everything we have received from the Lord is meant to be put to good use and freely shared with others. Just as the Apostles saw, heard and touched the saving power of Jesus (cf. 1 Jn 1:1-4), we too can daily touch the sorrowful and glorious flesh of Christ. There we can find the courage to share with everyone we meet a destiny of hope, the sure knowledge that the Lord is ever at our side. As Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves: the Church's evangelizing mission finds outward fulfilment in the transformation of our world and in the care of creation."

Next weekend, October 23 and 24, we will have a concrete opportunity to support the missionary work of the Church throughout the world through the annual collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. This collection supports mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe, where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. As little as \$25 helps support a catechist for a month in remote Latin America; \$75 provides for the work of religious Sisters caring for orphaned children in Africa; and \$100 assists poor children in boarding schools in Asia.

Please keep the Pope's missionary efforts in your prayers and give generously to next week's collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.
