

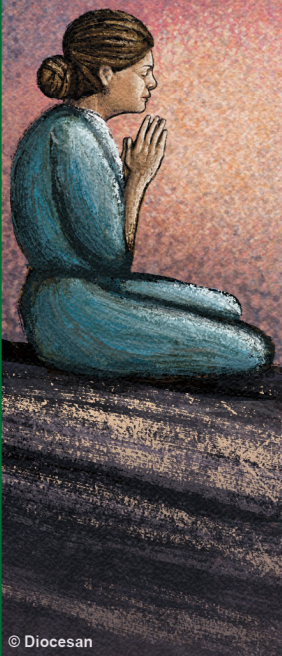

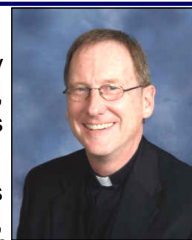
### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Along with many other parishioners, I am leaving Monday morning for a 10-day Redeemer Radio Odyssey to Italy. We will attend a papal audience on Wednesday and we will pray in the great churches of Rome, Assisi, Siena, Florence, and several other cities. We will remember the parish in prayer at all of those sites and we ask for prayers on our pilgrimage. We return the evening of October 31.

We have a membership drive this weekend for the Knights of Columbus. Catholic men are eligible for this group. 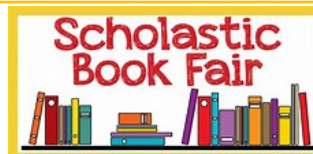

### FROM THE ORGAN BENCH I WILL LIFT UP MY EYES

This weekend in our readings, we have one of the most meaningful of all 150 of the Psalms. Psalm 121, "I will lift up my eyes to the hills" is a prayer of hope, comfort, and reflection.

Our Adult Choir and Parish Children's Choir both share musical settings of these verses at our 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. Masses respectively this weekend.

The arrangement sung by the Adult Choir was composed by Normand Gouin. Gouin is a composer of sacred music residing in Jersey City, New Jersey and, is Organist/Associate Musician at the Church of the Holy Cross-St John the Baptist in midtown-Manhattan. He was also honored to have one of his hymns chosen to be sung at a gathering marking Pope Francis' first official visit to the United States.

The Parish Children's Choir sings a setting of the Psalm composed by Austin Lovelace. Lovelace who passed away in 2010 at age 91, was one of the most prolific composers of church music during the twentieth century and was a musician at Wellshire Presbyterian Church in Denver, Colorado for 52 years. Having composed more than 800 pieces, he was also honored to have served as an organist for a gathering of the World Council of Churches.

The choirs hope that the sung words of Psalm 121 will help you reflect and pray during our Masses this weekend.

### **Critical Need for Ushers at St Charles Sunday Masses**

The usher ministry at St Charles has faithfully staffed all Sunday Masses over the years and many of the special Holy Day Masses that do not land on Sunday. It has historically been a ministry to serve the parish and all parishioners every week of the year. There are five usher teams for each Mass time that serve every fifth month (i.e. approximately twice a year).

Due to aging of our volunteers and normal turnover, we have developed a critical need to add to the 11:00 am and 5:00 p.m. Mass times. Several of the teams supporting these Mass times are in danger of collapsing entirely if support cannot be obtained.

We also have openings at all Mass times for those volunteers who wish to help but are unable to volunteer during the critical Mass times listed above. If you are available for Saturday 5:00 p.m. or Sundays at 7:30 a.m. or 9:00 a.m., we can use your assistance as well.

This ministry is a great way for parents (men or women) to participate with their children (5<sup>th</sup> grade or over please) in helping to instill a sense of volunteerism. It's also a good way for young adults and high school/college students to continue to volunteer and support their parish.

Fr. Tom has scheduled a meeting on November 21, at 7:00 p.m. to welcome new and existing ushers to the ministry. We will cover procedures and key responsibilities as well as special needs of the teams (e.g. training, standard procedures, emergency procedures, etc.). This meeting is intended for all ushers.
