A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

As you read this bulletin, I am in Italy with two busloads of pilgrims on a Redeemer Radio Odyssey. Our Sunday Mass will be celebrated at the altar of St. Longinus in Lanciano, the same altar at which there was an 8th century Eucharistic miracle—the Body and Blood of Christ took the form of human flesh and blood during Mass. Please remember us in prayer as we travel. We will offer prayers for the parish from many holy sites. We return the evening of Oct. 31.

My father died last week in Lafayette at age 90, after a year-long descent into dementia. It was a beautiful death. The hospice workers predicted that the death was coming and I was blessed to be with him. With

my Mom, I celebrated Mass next to the bed in his room, I anointed him one last time, and he died peacefully in sleep as I held his hand.

Being in the middle of this scene reinforced for me the great gift that we have in our faith. When it is his turn for judgment, Dad will meet Jesus—the same Jesus he has known and followed all of his life. The family is left knowing that God is going to carry us, and we are left knowing the promise of the Kingdom of Heaven. We look forward to a day when we will join with our loved ones in a life with no more confusion, no more grief, and no more tears. I can't imagine the perspective of a person without faith, seeing death as a final end to life and the end of a relationship of love. For the person without faith, death must be a dark and terrifying prospect. I am grateful for my Dad's good life; I am grateful for his peaceful death; and I am especially grateful for the faith. God will take care of us.

Critical Need for Ushers at St Charles Sunday Masses
