## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR.

I'm seeing a lot of fun Halloween decorations this time of year and wondering how we can draw more attention to the holy days that follow. November 1 is the Feast Day of All Saints. It is the time when we remember all of the folks in heaven, those who are famous and those who are not. We tell their stories and we ask for their prayers.

This is one of the Holy Days which has no Obligation when it falls on a Saturday or Monday, yet it is surely for any Catholic a holy day. Our Masses will be at 6:15 and 8:15 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Tuesday is the Feast of All Souls. This is a day to remember loved ones who have died and all of the souls in purgatory. As we do every year, we will have a book near the altar with names of loved ones who have died. You are welcome to enter names of those for whom we should pray. (It is the same book used now for several years. There is no need to repeat names from years past.) Additionally, this year on All Soul's Day, at our 6:30 p.m. Mass, we will read names of parishioners and loved ones who have died since November of last year and we will light a candle for each. We have the names of those who had St. Charles funerals, but if you have a loved one who has died this year and you would like to take part in this Mass, please call us and give us the name so it will be included.

Thursday is the feast day of St. Charles Borromeo. We will welcome Bishop Rhoades on Thursday as he comes to offer the Sacrament of Confirmation to a large group of teens. Everyone is welcome to the 7:00 p.m. Confirmation Mass on Thursday. (There will be no 6:30 p.m. Mass.) Since St. Charles is our parish patron, we will celebrate his feast also next weekend.

We are organizing a chapter of Catholic Relief Service here at St. Charles, and we would love to have more members. Catholic Relief Service is the effort of the US Catholic Church to help with the struggles of poverty in third world countries. A parish chapter is a group of 8 or 10 which meets once or twice a month to listen to a speaker in a video conference, to write letters to Congress, to promote the Rice Bowl, and to learn and pray together. For those of us who dream of helping in foreign missions but can't really do that, this is our effort to see what we can do.
