A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We congratulate Sr. Anita Holzmer, OSF, who is celebrating this weekend her 50th Anniversary with the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration. Sr. Anita teaches at St. Francis University. She and her family will join us for a celebration at the 11:00 a.m. Mass this Sunday.

As mentioned in last week's bulletin, we can help those in purgatory with our prayers. The Catholic Manual of Indulgences states that anyone who devoutly visits a cemetery between Nov. 1 and Nov. 8 and prays for the dead can receive a plenary indulgence. On All Soul's Day, Nov. 2, a plenary indulgence is offered by visiting the church and reciting an Our Father and the Creed. In both cases, the usual requirements are needed for an indulgence: excluding of all attachment to sin, sacramental confession and reception of Communion within several days, and prayers for the intention of the pope.

As our nation holds elections this week, we pray for God's wisdom and guidance. Passions are high as we approach this election, and I pray that once it is over, we will be able to heal and work together for the good of our nation.

The Feast Day of St. Charles Borromeo is November 4, this Wednesday. We will have fourth graders dressed like saints at the school Mass on Wednesday and we will expose the Blessed Sacrament for quiet adoration time in the church on Wednesday evening from 7:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. Please join us for some time of quiet prayer. The feast day will also be celebrated at all Masses next weekend.

Our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society will have a truck in the parking lot next weekend to accept donations of non-perishable food for those in need here in Fort Wayne. Please be generous.

As we are watching a spike in corona virus cases, now is not the time to let our guard down. We ask everyone to wear a mask at Mass, covering both mouth and nose. We need to do our best to maintain distance and to sanitize hands. Until the pandemic is over, we recommend receiving Holy Communion on the hand, so that the priest can avoid your breath on his fingers. If it is important to you to receive on the tongue, we ask that you come to the center aisle and receive Communion from the priest. We have been blessed in our parish so far; we had a funeral in April for a corona virus victim who died in a nursing facility in Indianapolis. We have had none since. However, I have been told of two local parishes having funerals this week for victims of the virus. May God lead us through this pandemic.

I was supposed to leave this weekend for a Redeemer Radio pilgrimage to the Holy Land. It was no surprise when that trip was canceled. I am going to take a few days off and be gone next weekend. I haven't figured out yet where I'm going, but I'll use my imagination and pretend I'm in the Holy Land.


