A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

During the month of November, we especially remember the souls in Purgatory, and we pray for loved ones who have died. We don't know just what the judgment will be when a person dies, and we continue to pray for our loved ones who may be in Purgatory. Near the altar we have a book with names of loved ones who have died. We remember them in each of our Masses. You are very welcome to add new names. [It is the

same book we have used for many years. There is no need to add the same names already included.]

A reminder: a plenary indulgence is offered for those who visit a cemetery from Nov. 1-8 to pray for the dead. With a sacramental Confession, receiving Holy Communion and prayers for the pope, you can offer an indulgence for a person in Purgatory.

This week is a National Vocation Awareness Week. With years of praying our parish prayer for vocations, our parish has been very blessed. In the past ten years, we have had three young men from our parish ordained priests and one woman who took final vows with the Poor Clares. We currently have three seminarians studying for our diocese, one for the Holy Cross Brothers and one for the Carthusians. We are in need of more young men to answer a call to the Priesthood and both men and women to answer a call to Religious Life. We continue our prayer. I also encourage everyone to look around. If you have a friend or family member who might be a good candidate, simply ask: "Have you ever thought about the Priesthood or Religious Life?"

An interesting upcoming event: at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 22, there will be an interfaith Thanksgiving service held at the Jewish Temple on Old Mill Road. Jewish, Buddhist, Bahai, Catholic and Protestant leaders will offer readings on the theme of Thanksgiving. Everyone is welcome.

Finally: for those who are planning in advance: Christmas will fall on a Sunday this year. We will maintain our normal Christmas Mass schedule, 4:00 p.m., 6:30 p.m. and midnight on Christmas Eve and 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. on Christmas morning. Even though it is a Sunday, we are not scheduling a Mass on December 25 in the evening.

November 8


This week in RCIA, we will take a look at the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. These two sacraments, along with the Holy Eucharist, constitute the Sacraments of Initiation. Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life. It cleanses the person from Original Sin and incorporates them into the Mystical Body of Christ. Confirmation seals the individual with the gift of the Holy Spirit which allows them to live more bravely the Christian life.
