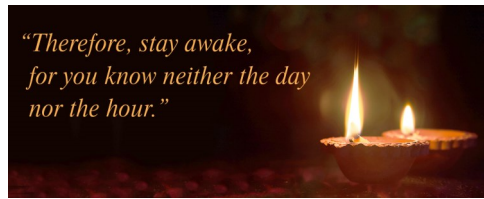

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



With a canceled Holy Land trip, I have some open time marked on my calendar and I will be away this weekend. As I am writing this column, I haven't decided yet where I'm going, but it won't be anywhere near the Middle East. I will return Monday evening.

Planning for Christmas: Despite the pandemic, I am expecting that we will have big crowds for our Christmas Eve Masses. We are planning simultaneous Masses for both the 4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. Masses on Christmas Eve. At both of those times, we will have one priest offering Mass in the church and another in the gym. I don't anticipate that crowds will be big enough that we will have such a need at the Midnight Mass or the Christmas morning Masses. We will livestream the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve.

We had a Finance Committee meeting last week, and I reassure you that our finances are sound at this time despite the pandemic. Our offertory has fallen by 7.5%, but we are paying our bills and the government stimulus program has been a great help. It is interesting to note that we have not had a drop in gifts from automatic bank transfers, nor in gifts from offertory envelopes. The loose collection—cash dropped in the basket—has dropped dramatically.

"This Week in RCIA"

November 10

This week in RCIA, we will take a look at the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. These two sacraments, along with the Holy Eucharist, constitute the Sacraments of Initiation. Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life. It cleanses the person from Original Sin and incorporates them into the Mystical Body of Christ. Confirmation seals the individual with the gift of the Holy Spirit which allows them to live more bravely the Christian life. We see, in the Acts of the Apostles, the Apostles hid in fear for they thought they were going to be killed like Christ. The Holy Spirit then rushed upon them and they were then able to act boldly and proclaimed Christ to others. Let us pray to act so boldly for Christ. Click on "Weekly Commitment" or "Become a Sub." Then, click on the time slot(s) you would like to select and complete the information on the screen (first and last name, email address, cell phone and home phone numbers and whether you would like to receive text or email messages). Read the agreement at the bottom of the screen and click "Submit."

You also may sign up for an Adoration time through their Parish Office (260-489-3537 ext. 3). As of November 1, the Oratory will remain unlocked during the daytime hours. **If you sign up for a time between 8:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.**, you will be contacted with instructions for requesting a fob for access to the Oratory, and you will be notified when your fob is ready for you to pick up from the St. Vincent Parish Office.
