A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We congratulate the young parishioners who took part in the Sacrament of Confirmation on Monday. Most were baptized as babies and their parents and godparents took baptismal vows on their behalf. Now, they have publicly proclaimed the vows themselves and the Bishop has anointed them again with the Sacred Chrism, offering greater gifts from the Holy Spirit.

Next weekend, representatives of *Bethlehem Christian Families*, a nonprofit organization, will offer crucifixes, religious art work and rosaries, all made of olivewood, for sale in the Gathering Space after Masses. These items are made by Christians in the Holy Land, and the goal of this organization is to help

churches in the Middle East and to establish a charitable hospital in Bethlehem. For more information, check the website www.landofpeace.org and www.bcfmission.com.

The highlight of our Italian pilgrimage was the opportunity to celebrate Mass in some of the great Basilicas and Churches of Italy. Fr. Eric Burgener and I celebrated at altars in St. Peter's, St. Mary Major and St. John Lateran in Rome, in the Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi, between the tombs of St. Benedict and St. Scholastica at Monte Cassino, and in St. Catherine's Parish Church in Siena. Of course, beyond the thrill of these historic locations and the memories of the saints who lived and died there, it is the very same Mass celebrated in communion with the very same saints right here at home.

I will be gone a few days again this week, meeting up with an old seminary friend. He wants to visit historic Lincoln sites in Illinois. Ironically, he is the pastor in a beautiful little town on Cape Cod, one of the great tourist destinations of our country.

Critical Need for Ushers at St Charles Sunday Masses

The usher ministry at St Charles has faithfully staffed all Sunday Masses over the years and many of the special Holy Day Masses that do not land on Sunday. It has historically been a ministry to serve the parish and all parishioners every week of the year. There are five usher teams for each Mass time that serve every fifth month (i.e. approximately twice a year).

Due to aging of our volunteers and normal turnover, we have developed a critical need to add to the 11:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Mass times. Several of the teams supporting these Mass times are in danger of collapsing entirely if support cannot be obtained.

We also have openings at all Mass times for those volunteers who wish to help but are unable to volunteer during the critical Mass times listed above. If you are available for Saturday 5:00 p.m. or Sundays at 7:30 a.m. or 9:00 a.m., we can use your assistance as well

This ministry is a great way for parents (men or women) to participate with their children (5th grade or over please) in helping to instill a sense of volunteerism. It's also a good way for young adults and high school/college students to continue to volunteer and support their parish.

Fr. Tom has scheduled a meeting on November 21, at 7:00 p.m. to welcome new and existing ushers to the ministry. We will cover procedures and key responsibilities as well as special needs of the teams (e.g. training, standard procedures, emergency procedures, etc.). This meeting is intended for all ushers.

or many people, a speeding ticket usually means a bit of embarrassment, a fine, or the inconvenience of appearing in court. But for those living in poverty, a speeding ticket can become a life-altering event.

In New Orleans, Donald lost his license years ago because he was caught speeding, could not pay the fine, and could not take off work to go to court. Contempt of court citations and unlicensed driving tickets quickly compounded the initial fine. Donald was losing hope that he could clear the backlog, get a better-paying job, and support his growing family while living right above the poverty level.


Thanks to your generosity to CCHD, the New Orleans Workers Center for Racial Justice (NOWCRJ) was able to provide Donald with the support he needed to change his situation. NOWCRJ hosted a clinic where Donald set up payment plans for his fines and got his license reinstated. Now Donald has a new job and has

been able to save money to move into his own apartment. NOWCRJ is also working with the judicial system to reduce backlogs, expunge records, and change how penalties are issued. With your contributions, our brothers and sisters across the country are breaking out of the cycle of poverty.



SCRIP Rebates – If you are new to St. Charles parish and the **SCRIP** program, you may wonder what the parish does with their portion of the rebates. Some of the past projects that were made possible thanks to **SCRIP** include: the beautiful rectory where our priests live, the renovation of the old rectory into the parish offices, the Gathering Space, the Kindergarten wing, repairs and replacement of the church roof, and the new organ. Proceeds from **SCRIP** help to keep our parish up to date and in good repair.
