A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR . .

I was very surprised by the response to our parish outing to the Shrine of the Holy Relics at Maria Stein. I'm writing this column before the trip takes place, but we have over 40 people signed up at this time, a much bigger response than expected. We will plan other outings in the future.

We have 80 people finishing *Alpha* this week. 


