A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

On Corpus Christi Sunday, the Catholic Church throughout the US began a three-year period focusing on the Eucharist. We thank Madeline Nugent and the Order of Penitents for arranging for the Eucharistic Miracle display in the Gathering Space last weekend as part of that emphasis. The display provided a fascinating

view of God's work in the world. The Lord wants us to become one with Him in Holy Communion-- and He has gone to great lengths to show us that.

Our All Soul's Day Mass last week was a beautiful event. In a darkened church, we read the names of loved ones who died in the past year and lit a candle for each. Many people remarked that we had so many names. Since All Soul's Day last year, our parish celebrated funeral liturgies for 74 loved ones. That sounds like an alarming number for the parish, but I count 85 baptisms during the same span. The Lord puts us into this world, calls us out, and has an eternal plan for us. Our parish is here to help us on that journey.

Wednesday evening we will have a unique event called "Unity Night." It will be an evening of praise music, with friends from Evangelical congregations joining us in prayer. Everyone is invited to the Hession Center on Wednesday evening. The doors open with refreshments at 6:30 p.m. The music begins at 7:00 p.m.

Our parish staff will be making a retreat day on Wednesday, spending the day praying together and reflecting on the mission of the parish. We plan to have someone to answer the office phone and take messages on Wednesday, it would be best if those with routine business would call on us on a different day.

Some exciting news: We are making plans to open our nursery during the 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Masses in the very near future. A married couple recently registered as new parishioners and mentioned that they had staffed a nursery in their previous parish and would be happy to organize that here. They are recruiting volunteers and we are in the process of organizing things, screening and training all volunteers, and making this happen. Our goal is to open on December 4. Watch for further developments.

You must be as a burning candle with no other desire than to be consumed in His honor. Surrender yourself to the Mercy of Providence and let Him do with you according to His designs."
