A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR.

Last week, Bishop Rhoades joined us on the Feast Day of St. Charles for the Sacrament of Confirmation. It was beautiful to see his slow and deliberate manner as he Confirmed each of our 81 youth. It is the great hope of our parish that our young people will live their lives as committed Catholics and followers of

Christ. These young people are now equipped with gifts of the Holy Spirit to help on that path.

I was also much impressed by last weekend's youth retreat. Roughly 60 high schoolers spent the weekend at St. Felix Retreat House in Huntington, joining in prayer, listening to witness talks, taking part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Mass, and spending time in Adoration through the night. Good things are happening in this parish.

Catholic Relief Society is the organization of our US Catholic Church aimed at helping people in areas of poverty in developing countries. We are organizing a small group in our parish to support this work in our parish. If you might be interested, let me know. Please notice the new landscaping around the main entry to our church. Thanks to the labors of The Plant Center and 14 of our Knights of Columbus, we now have trees, shrubs and flowers which will make our church more beautiful and inviting from the outside. When our church renovations are done and we return to the church in the spring, we will have a blooming showcase on the outside as well as a beautiful new look on the inside. In addition to our workers, we offer thanks to all who supported the Borromeo Bash and backed this project.

Next weekend we will have olivewood sales in the Gathering Space. This is a chance to support Christian families in Bethlehem during hard times. The political scene is difficult in the Holy Land, tourism has been shut down by the pandemic, and Christians are leaving.

The Knights of Columbus presented a check to the parish this week representing the profits from their recent fish fry. The money will go towards our renovation fund. We are grateful.

Samer Awwad representing the Bethlehem Christian Families; a nonprofit organization through Land of Peace will be with us this weekend, speaking about the Christian situation in the Holy Land and selling Crucifixes, religious art work, and rosaries- all made of olive wood which is native to Israel and Bethlehem. Since tourism has greatly depleted, Christian families in the holy land, who depend on tourists, have been greatly affected. The goal of this mission is to help many organizations and Churches in the Middle East. 

The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on Monday, November 15, at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center, Room B. Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If that is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

We have seen a marked increase in the number of homeless families coming to us for help. For example, in October we helped a man with two young sons that were in the process of relocating to Fort Wayne, but did not have a job or housing as of yet. We were able to provide them with a week in a motel and gift cards for food. The father was diligently looking for work and the children are enrolled in school.

Another family we helped was a mother and daughter. Mother is within three semesters of getting her degree from St. Francis. She needed help with part of her rent, utilities and food. We were able to assist her with these needs helping her to continue her education.

In total we spent \$2,687 in October helping those in need.

We want to give a *BIG THANKS* to everyone that helped with our great success in the Friends of the Poor Walk on October 3. Through your generous support we were able to raise over \$16,000. We especially want to thank Fr. Tom for his support and participation. He raised more money than any of the local parish priest. We received another \$1,000 from the proceeds of a concert given by Fr. John Sheenen, Chaplain at St. Francis University and a member of the Knights of Columbus. These funds will help us to continue our work with the needy.
