A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My mini-vacation last week was spent in St. Louis and environs. When I travel, I enjoy attending Mass in various parishes. On this trip, I couldn't help but watch, with some amusement, the wide variety of virus-prevention efforts.

Every parish I observed had a mandate for masks and had hand sanitizers openly available. Beyond that, there was a lot of variety. In one parish, I had to make a reservation two days in advance to attend a weekend Mass. There were instructions not to come more than 30 minutes early, since ushers would have to check us in, and not to stay after, since the ushers would be sanitizing pews. In one parish, at the end of Mass, people waited patiently as the ushers dismissed them pew by pew, avoiding crowding around the door. In one parish the priest wore a mask through the Mass, removing it only at the pulpit and when he received Communion. In one parish, an usher next to the priest sprayed each communicant's hands with sanitizer before the Host was offered. In another, the priest asked those who wanted to receive Communion on the tongue to kneel at the Communion rail and they were served after the people standing in line in the aisle. In one parish, we were told to be careful with traffic in the parking lot because the deacon would be distributing Communion to people in their cars who didn't come inside. Each of the parishes encouraged singing with masks on, though none had hymnals available.

Some day when this pandemic is behind us, we will have a better picture of just how many people were afflicted, just how dangerous the virus was, and which practices were effective and which weren't in slowing the spread and in keeping people safe. For now, we are left following the directives of our bishop, and trying to be careful. There is another challenge which may be more important: Trying to focus more on Jesus than on a virus.

Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If that

During the month of October we were able to help 64 individuals consisting of 38 adults and 26 children. We provided \$2,564.50 in rent, \$467.45 in utility payments, \$331.16 for medical bills, \$130 for furniture, \$79 in repairs and \$185.25 for food which provided 975 pounds of food. In addition we gave \$200 to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family for a total of \$3,957.36 to help the needy.
