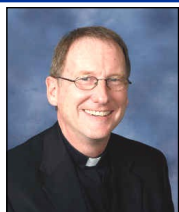

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

We wish everyone a beautiful Thanksgiving this week. Thanksgiving arose as a civic holiday, not a Church holiday. I am proud to live in a nation which decided many years ago that it was so important to stop and offer prayers of thanks to God that we should have a national holiday. Maybe I'm cynical, but I can't imagine that kind of discussion today passing in the Congress and then being approved by our courts. Our Mass on Thursday will be at 8:15 a.m.

There will be an interfaith Thanksgiving event held on Tuesday evening at Temple Achduth Vesholom, the Jewish Temple on Old Mill Road. I will offering a little reading, expressing our thankfulness to God. Leaders from the Jewish, Hindu, Bahai, Buddhist, and Protestant traditions will also offer readings. While I am not exactly sure what to expect, it should be an interesting event to reach out in goodwill to neighbors of other faiths and to learn a bit about their faith. Anyone who would be interested is invited to join us at the Temple at 7:00 p.m.

Next Sunday, we begin the season of Advent. The Gloria will be missing from the Mass, an Advent wreath will remind us of our progress through the season, and we will joyfully await our celebration of the birth of Christ. Advent is a beautiful season, but a difficult season for most of us. Surrounded by a world that is already celebrating Christmas, we are a people who are still waiting.

We will have several extra events taking place during Advent, giving us more opportunities to enter into the season. An Advent evening of Recollection is scheduled on the Holy Day, December 8. There will be a talk and time spent in quiet Adoration that evening. On December 10, we will have a special Mass begun by candlelight in a dark church at 6:45 a.m., honoring the Blessed Mother as the sun rises. On December 12, we are invited to St. Patrick's Parish early in the morning to celebrate Our Lady of Guadalupe with a Spanish Mass, singing and dancing. On December 14, we will have an evening parish Penance Service, offering a time to gather for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. There have already been questions about Mass obligations. If you attend any Christmas Mass, the obligation for Sunday is also fulfilled. While many people do come for Mass on Christmas Eve and also Christmas Morning, there is no obligation to come twice. Our Christmas Masses: Saturday evening at 4:00 p.m., 6:30 p.m. and Midnight; and Sunday Morning at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

This Week in RCIA

November 22

This week in RCIA, we will take a look at the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the font and apex of the Christian life because it is Christ Himself. The institution of the Holy Eucharist took place during the Last Supper which celebrated, in an anticipatory way, the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. Jesus, in the Gospel of John, stated the importance of the Eucharist, "Amen, Amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). May we gain a better understanding of the mystery of the Eucharist. ST. VINCENT DEPAUL SOCIETY

The St. Charles Council of St. Vincent dePaul Society will meet on **Monday, November 21**, at 7:00 p.m. in the **Hession Center, Room B**. Our organization does many different corporal works of mercy, such as feeding the hungry and clothing the naked. If this is something that is important to you, please plan to attend our next meeting to find out how you can lend a hand.

During the month of October, we were able to help 98 individuals consisting of 56 adults and 42 children. We provided \$ 3,206.03 in rent and motel stays, \$ 980.72 in utility payments, \$ 475.00 in cards for gas and food, \$ 360.00 for furniture and household items, \$ 400.59 in car repairs, and \$ 209.00 for food which provided 1100 pounds of food. In addition, we give \$ 200 monthly to St. Patrick's Parish to help an immigrant family. We spent a total of \$ 5,832.14 to help the needy.

Your generosity in donating clothing and household items is important to the success of the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store which in turn helps many needy in the community. To maximize the value of those donations, please be sure clothes are clean and in good repair and that household items are in good working and useable condition.

Only through your generosity have we been able to help so many. We are very grateful for your continued support. Thank you.

Do you own a business and give presents at Christmas to your employees? **SCRIP** gift cards make the best **employee rewards!** It's also a great way to support St. Charles at no extra cost to you or your business. We have access to hundreds of popular brands without any activation fees (that you pay when you buy at a store). No matter your budget, there are a plethora of gift cards you can buy to connect with your staff and make them feel appreciated. Talk to a **SCRIP** coordinator if you have any questions.

Online Customer Tip: Have you been hesitant to **use e-gift cards when eating at a restaurant?** Here's how! Wait until you have the bill before purchasing an e-gift card through the RaiseRight app. When your server hands you the bill, tell him/her that you would like to use an e-gift card as payment. Most servers will just have you write down the gift card number and pin number on the receipt. It's that simple! When purchasing the e-card, it's best to get as close to the amount you owe without going over. For example, if your total is \$37.50, order your e-card for \$35. Then, use a credit card or cash to pay the balance and any tip. This way you don't have money left over on an e-card that you will forget about.

For more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has supported organizations that combat poverty and improve the lives of people in communities across the United States. From empowering immigrants in towns along the southern border to advocating for improved housing and educational opportunities in northern and midwestern cities, CCHD-funded groups tackle a wide range of economic and social justice challenges that affect local communities in rural and urban areas.

In areas of Tennessee where coal-mining operations and landfills have caused water pollution and other environmental damage, Statewide Organizing for Community eMpowerment (SOCM) works with governments and regulatory agencies to limit hazardous waste disposal in landfills and to require environmental cleanup as part of the permitting process for new business operations.

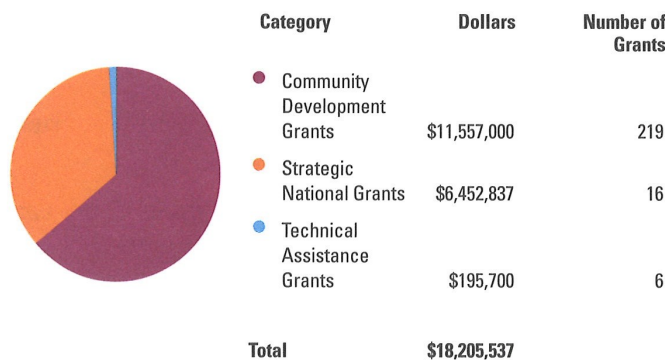
Environmental damage affects all of us, most especially low-income people who are affected by water pollution resulting from mineral extraction, lack of access to healthy foods in urban “food deserts,” and natural disasters caused by climate change. The Church teaches that “the natural environment is

a collective good, the patrimony of all humanity and the responsibility of everyone” (Pope Francis, *Laudato Si'*, no. 95). Since the release of *Laudato Si'* in 2015, CCHD has invested more than \$4.3 million in organizations that work to protect the environment and combat pollution. When you support CCHD, you support organizations that work to protect the air, soil, and water for all the members of their communities.

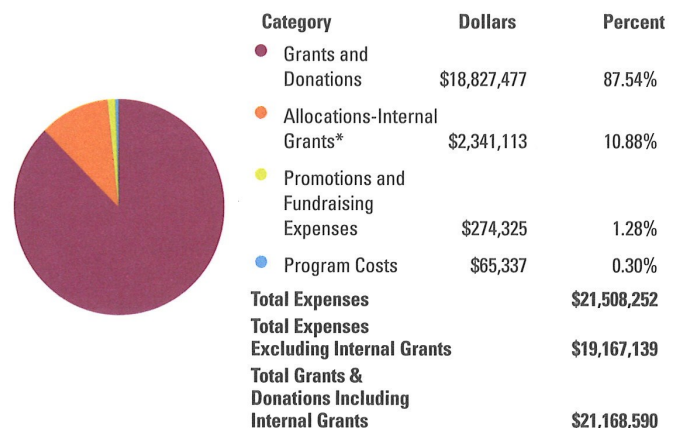
