A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

We celebrate Thanksgiving this week. Even if it is an unusual Thanksgiving without large gatherings, it is still a wonderful time to stop and remember our blessings. Mass on Thanksgiving morning is 9:00 a.m.

Next weekend begins our celebration of Advent. This is the time of year in which we prepare ourselves to meet the Lord. The world around us is preparing for Christmas with shopping, decorating and parties (socially-distanced, of course.) While all of that is good, we also need time for prayer, reflection, and acts of charity.

The liturgies of Advent begin with the lighting of the candles in our Advent wreath. As in years past, we will have the lights darkened in our sanctuary, drawing attention to the candles and reminding us that we are waiting in darkness to greet Jesus, the Light of the World. There is no Gloria in the Mass during Advent; we wait until Christmas to sing with the angels in Bethlehem, "Glory to God in the Highest."

On Christmas Eve, we are planning simultaneous Masses in the church and in the gym at 4:00 p.m. and at 6:30 p.m. Each location will have a priest, a beautifully-decorated space, and fine music. As the church approaches capacity, we will direct people to the gym. The Midnight Mass and the two Christmas morning Masses, 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m., will be held in the church.

For three years now we have been offering financial help to seminary in Uganda, sending an annual check. Last spring we sent \$11,000, allowing them to complete construction on a very simple two-story classroom building, built by hand with no electricity, no plumbing and no glass in the windows. Since then, several parishioners made additional gifts and last week we wired \$4,000 to Uganda. We received a quick and very grateful response telling us this was "a great rescue." As the area has been hit hard with the corona virus, funds have been very low and they have been struggling to feed their students. They told us that our gift will provide a lot of beans and maize flour, allow them to pay their electric bills, and buy detergent for sanitizing.
