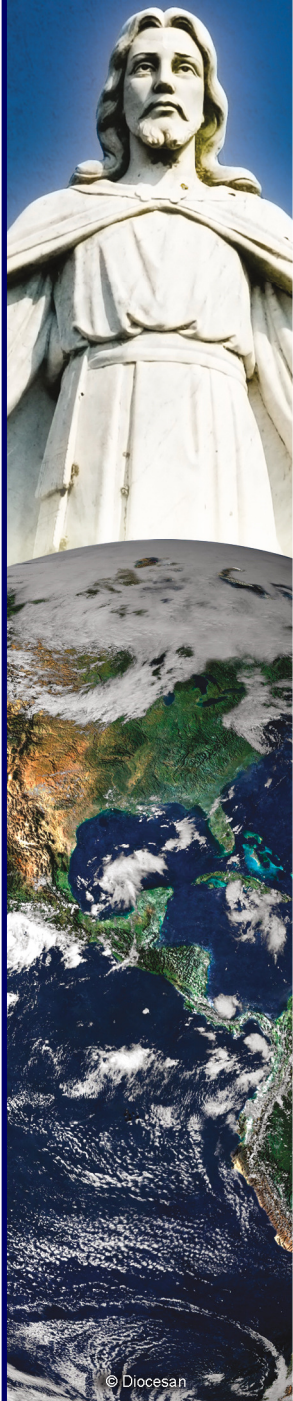

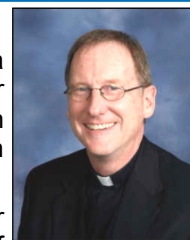

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

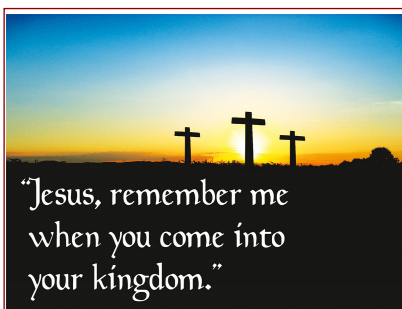
Thursday is Thanksgiving, a day to rest and a day to focus on our many gifts from God. I recently spent a few days traveling to the homes of Abraham Lincoln and Ulysses S. Grant. Schedule Reminders – Most of us will pause this week to reflect on the things we are thankful for and the blessings of the year. We will take a small break as well; there are **NO SCRIP sales on FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 29**. Sales will take place as normal on Saturday, November 30 and Sunday, December 1.

Weather delays - Believe it or not, we are already having the kind of weather that can impact our school schedule. What does that mean for SCRIP? If school calls for a 2 hour delay, SCRIP follows the delay. On Mondays, we still collect the orders the students bring in, fill them and return them to school before dismissal time. On a Friday, if there is a 2 hour delay, the Friday morning sales are delayed as well – they take place in the Hession Center from 10:00 a.m.-11:00 a.m. and school orders are collected and filled as well. If school is cancelled on a Monday, SCRIP will move our Monday tasks to Tuesday. If school is cancelled on Friday, SCRIP sales are cancelled. Stay warm and safe.
