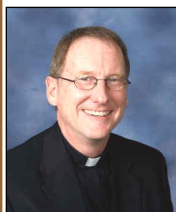

### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR.

This Wednesday is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have a vigil Mass Tuesday evening at 6:30 p.m. and Masses Wednesday at 6:15 a.m., 8:15 a.m. and 6:30 p.m.

Next weekend we will have our annual collection to help with our retired religious. Sister Genevieve will offer a few words about the collection and the needs of our elderly religious. There is an envelope in the envelope packet for this collection. If you don't have the envelope, you may write a check and mark "Retired Religious" in the memo line or you can drop a gift into the extra baskets which will be marked "Retired Religious" on the tables in the back of the church.

Our school Athletic Board is offering a pancake breakfast next Sunday from 8:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m. Stop by the school cafeteria on Sunday morning for some good pancakes and to meet other St. Charles parishioners.

Advent is especially a time for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We will have a parish Penance Service at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 15. Everyone is welcome.

Finally, the excitement is building with our church renovation. There are two: the lamb and the pelican. The lamb, of course, represents Jesus, the Lamb of God. With our renovation, the wooden carving of a lamb which is now on our church altar will be relocated to the altar in the chapel. The altar in the church, which will be faced in marble, will feature a marble carving of a pelican with her babies. We include a picture below of the carving. There was a story told in ancient times that during a drought or a famine, the mother pelican who couldn't feed her babies would use her beak to pierce her breast and feed her young with her own blood. The earliest Christians saw this as a symbol of the self-sacrifice of Christ; He offers His blood that we may live. The image of a mother pelican has been featured on Catholic altars since the second century. This beautiful carving of a pelican and her babies was done by stone carvers in Carrara, Italy, and is now in transit to St. Charles.

### "This Week in RCIA"

December 7

This week in RCIA, we will take a look at the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist is the font and apex of the Christian life because it is Christ Himself. The institution of the Holy Eucharist took place during the Last Supper which celebrated, in an anticipatory way, the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. Jesus, in the Gospel of John, stated the importance of the Eucharist, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). May we gain a better understanding of the mystery of the Eucharist. Please pray for our catechumens and candidates, Aaron, Sabrina, Susan, Bryan, and Jena as they continue their journey in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.



"Hail Mary, full of grace". For thousands of years, millions of times per day the Virgin Mary is greeted by the faithful with the greeting of the Archangel. The sons of the Church learn from the words of the Archangel Gabriel that the fullness of the mystery of God's grace was realized in Holy Mary. St. Paul the Apostle teaches us that the Father made all fullness dwell in His Incarnate Son (c.f. Col 1:12-20), which overflows from Christ's head and spills out on His Mystical Body that is the Church. Before descending in Body, Christ's fullness was spread in a unique and unrepeatable way on Mary, predestined from eternity to be the Mother of God.

## **Rorate Caeli Mass at Saint Charles Saturday, December 11, at 6:45 a.m.**

The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion in which a Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. In many instances families and individuals travel an hour or more, rising and arriving very early for this stunningly beautiful Mass. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.

The Mass takes its title, *Rorate Caeli*, from the first words of the Entrance Antiphon, which are from Isaiah 45:8:

"Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem."

"Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. In the dimly lit setting, we prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born to Mary. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ.

Keeping the attitude of solemn watchfulness this tradition keeps, the music of the Mass on December 11, will be mostly a cappella chant sung by only a few voices. This style is meant to be largely meditative and lifts the mind of the attendant at Mass into the mystery.

Though it is early, it would be a beautiful sacrifice to make for the Lord during the penitential season of Advent. I highly encourage any and all to attend.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you may have heard, the United States Supreme Court will begin hearing oral arguments on December 1<sup>st</sup> in the case *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*. The specific question the Court will consider is whether a state may enact limits on abortion before viability, the point at which the baby is capable of living outside his or her mother's womb. This is what the Mississippi law in question did in prohibiting abortion after 15 weeks gestation, except in cases of medical emergency or severe fetal abnormality. Mississippi's law is consistent with what more than 90% of countries around the world already do.

In deliberating the *Dobbs* case, the Supreme Court will consider the correctness of its previous rulings in *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey*. These rulings essentially legalized abortion on demand through all nine months of pregnancy and severely restricted the ability of states to enact legislation to protect human life in the womb and to safeguard women's health. This has made the United States an extreme outlier in abortion policy, being one of only four countries, including China and North Korea, that allows the abortion of a child at any time during a woman's pregnancy.

Given the significance of the *Dobbs* case and its potential outcome, the USCCB Secretariat for Pro-Life Activities is participating in a campaign called Pray for Dobbs ([www.prayfordobbs.com](http://www.prayfordobbs.com)) which aims to unite Christians across our nation in praying and fasting for the Supreme Court justices as they deliberate this case, a decision in which is expected next June.

As we begin the holy season of Advent, I would like to encourage all of the Catholic faithful in our diocese to join me in participating in this prayer and fasting campaign until a decision is handed down in this case. I recommend choosing a time of day to say a prayer for this intention, or perhaps to pray the Rosary or the Divine Mercy chaplet, and to undertake some kind of fast once a week, such as skipping a meal or limiting yourself to one full meal, or fasting from something else like television or social media for that day. Fridays have long been observed as days of sacrifice in the Catholic tradition in honor of the Lord's sacrifice on Calvary, so you might consider making Fridays your day of fasting. This campaign would be beautiful to undertake as a family or with a group of friends, co-workers or classmates to help support each other in this effort on behalf of restoring the protection of the law to these least of our brothers and sisters before they are born.

May Our Lady, the Mirror of Justice, intercede for the justices of the Supreme Court as they deliberate this important case.
