## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend is the annual collection for Retired Religious. We are grateful to the sisters who have taught in our school and served in our parish for all of our 62 years. There is an envelope in the envelope packet for this collection, or you may mark a check or an envelope to see that it is used for the retired religious.

December 8 is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception. It is an important day in the Church, and it is an important day for us--the patronal feast of our nation and of our diocese. However, this year December 8 falls on a Sunday. When that happens, the Second Sunday of Advent takes precedence. Therefore, we will celebrate the Immaculate Conception of Mary on Monday, December 9. While it is still an important day for us, our bishops have determined that there will be no obligation on this holy day.

As we have built the relationship between St. Charles and St. Patrick's parishes, our parish has a special invitation this week to a delightful event at St. Patrick's. Very early on Thursday morning, the Latino parishioners of St. Patrick begin the celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe. At 5:00 a.m., the day begins with Mexican music, Aztec-style dance, and an acting out of the story of the miracle at Guadalupe. Mass will be celebrated at 6:00 a.m., and there are usually refreshments afterwards. Most everything will be done in Spanish, a beautiful exposure for us of the richness of our Church. This will be the third year that a group of St. Charles parishioners has attended. We have been very warmly welcomed, and I would love to see our group grow. Please join us at St. Patrick at 5:00 a.m. on Thursday if you are able.

The Cupertino Classic, a friendly basketball game between seminarians and priests from our diocese, will be held at Marian High School in Mishawaka on Friday, December 27, at 6:30 p.m. This is a family-friendly event and admission is free.

Advent is a time for Reconciliation, and there are many penance services taking place during this season. St. Vincent has a penance service on Dec. 11, St. John, New Haven on Dec. 17, St. Charles on Dec. 18, and St. Jude on Dec. 19. All begin at 7:00 p.m. We will have guides in the back of church for those who aren't sure about an Act of Contrition or the format of the sacrament. This is a chance to approach Christmas with sins washed away. Qm




SCRIP NEWS
