
SCHEDULE MASSES FOR 2020

A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Our Parish Penance Service will be held this Wednesday evening, December 18, at 7:00 p.m. After a short service, asking God's mercy, we will have many visiting priests to hear confessions. Please join us. This sacrament is Jesus' gift to us and can also be our gift to him.

We are coming very close to Christmas. I would encourage everyone to invite friends, neighbors and relatives to a Christmas Mass. This may be the easiest time of year to make an invitation. If you have relatives visiting, neighbors who don't go to a church, or someone who isn't very regular, invite them to come with you. As the angels brought the shepherds to the stable, we should do our best to do the same.



A few words on our Christmas Mass schedule: Our first Mass is 4:00 p.m. Mass on Christmas Eve. This Mass begins with the baby carried in procession and placed in our manger scene. This is the most crowded Mass of the year, and seats will be filled early.

Our next Mass is at 6:30 p.m. on Christmas Eve. Seating is far more available at the 6:30 p.m. Mass. The children's choir will sing and children will be invited forward for the nativity blessing.

The Midnight Mass at St. Charles actually begins at midnight. (I don't know of any other Fort Wayne parishes waiting for a midnight starting time.) This is our most formal Mass. After a half hour of music, we will begin in darkness with the singing of the ancient Christmas proclamation and then as we sing Silent Night, congregational candles will be lit to fill the darkness. The parish choir will be joined by professional musicians in this beautiful liturgy. Incense will also be used at both 6:30 p.m. and midnight.

On Christmas morning, Mass will be celebrated with joy and with carols at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

Let us keep this time of Advent holy. We are preparing for Jesus.
