

Dear Friends,

I will periodically offer in our parish bulletin for your consideration brief reviews of the books I have recently read. It is so important for us to continue to read, not merely for entertainment, but to remain students of life. This is especially needed in an age when so much information is so readily at our fingertips that we can be tempted not to truly learn, or oppositely, we are too inundated by entertainment media to even desire to learn. With that I offer my first review: Fr. Koehl



For Altar and Throne: The Rising in the Vendée Michael Davies, The Remnant Press, 1997. Pages: 92

*For Altar and Throne* is a brief historical account of France between 1793 and 1796, drawing special attention to the violent relationship between the newly founded Republic of France and the region known as the Vendée (von-day). The author, Mr. Michael Davies, himself an avid Catholic, makes special note of the Catholic perspective of this conflict.

Alongside the 'permanent dismissal' of King Louis XIV by "Madame la Guillotine" came a dismissal of everything that smacked of the old royal regime, including the nearly universal practice of the Catholic Faith by the French. France, being the eldest daughter of the Church, had been, to this point, Catholic to it's very soul, but the so-called 'Philosophes' had different ideas which they desired to implement. The book portrays the heroic figures of the 'Catholic and Royal Army of the Vendée' in their victory and their ultimate sacrifice, as well as the Martyrdom of the Royalist Catholics of the Vendée region.

*For Altar and Throne* is clearly not meant to be an in depth study of the French Revolution, rather it focuses on the cultural turnings of the period which shaped the French approach to the Faith at the turn of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century and highlights the martyrdom of the Vendée people. So, considering the proposed scope, I feel that Mr. Davies successfully achieved his goal. I enjoyed this book and recommend it to those who might wish to start a study of the French Revolution, reproach that topic from a Catholic perspective, or get a glimpse into the result of Enlightenment Philosophy in the Western World.

# EUCHARISTIC SAINT FOR DECEMBER BLESSED NIELS STENSENWAS

Born to a Lutheran family in 1638, Blessed Niels Stensenwas a famous scientist. As an adult, he specialized in medicine, particularly in the new science of anatomy. He discovered new organs and glands in the bodies of both animals and human beings. He is renowned for his work on the human brain, providing the basis for research throughout the following 200 years. His attendance at a Corpus Christi procession in 1666 moved him to consider Catholicism. After a thorough examination of the original Hebrew and Greek texts of the Bible, he wrote, "I became deeply convinced of the truth of what the Catholics [believe about the Holy Eucharist]". He converted to the Catholic faith and was ordained a priest in 1675, and later a bishop. There is only one human response to the self-giving love which shows itself on the cross and lives in the Church as the true bread of humanity," he wrote. "The more we discover and say "yes" to this love, the less do we remain as merely ourselves. The love of Christ urges us on." He was beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1988. His feast day is Dec. 5. #### EUCHARISTIC REFLECTION FOR DECEMBER THANKSGIVING AND WORSHIP

The word "Eucharist" literally means "thanksgiving." To give thanks properly, we should take a full, conscious, and active part in the liturgical celebration. We need to be conscious of the gift we have received, a gift that is none other than the Lord Himself in His act of self-giving. We become conscious of this gift when we actively engage our minds, hearts, and bodies to every part of the liturgy, allowing God through the words, actions, gestures, and even the moments of silence to speak to us. We actively and consciously participate by giving our full attention to the words being spoken in the prayers and the Scriptures, even if we have heard them hundreds of times before. We do so also by listening to the homily and reflecting upon how the Lord may be speaking to us through his ordained minister. We actively give thanks when we join in singing and in the responses; when we kneel, stand, and sit; and when we pay attention to the liturgical seasons where the entire history of what God has done for us, in and through His Son, is revealed to us. Our gratitude is also expressed in our worship of the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta reportedly once said: "When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you then. When you look at the Sacred Host, you understand how much Jesus loves you now. Read this and each month's full reflection at diocesefwsb.org/eucharist.
