School Desk Painting Project

For the second summer in a row Council 451beautified 90 ancient school desks. The second-grade desks had to be transported from the school to the parish office garage, one classroom at a time, where we removed the tops and cleaned all the sticky gunk off them. After that we sanded and primed the metal and sprayed them with a finish coat of clay colored industrial enamel. The desks were reassembled are returned to their original classroom.

The project began on Friday June 13th and was completed on July 5th. Because of the different steps involved we spent 3 days each week and 3-4 hours per day completing our tasks. Usually, 6-7 Knights per day were present resulting in a total of 200 plus hours.




