A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR



Before I came to St. Charles, our Lenten Stations of the Cross were offered on Sunday afternoons. In 2017, with hopes of increased attendance, we moved Stations to Friday evenings. The response has been good; we have had very good crowds on Friday evenings. However, thinking especially of those parishioners who don't drive after dark, this year we will offer the Stations at both times... Sunday afternoons and Friday evenings. Beginning this weekend, you are

invited to join us for Stations of the Cross at 3:00 p.m. on Sundays and at 7:00 p.m. on Fridays.

We have a very interesting opportunity this Friday evening, March 3. Father Robert Carlton will be joining us from Chicago to talk about Catholic Relief Service and to give us an idea of the ways that the US Catholic Church is helping worldwide, especially through the Rice Bowl Collection. We have parishioners cooking various foods from the third-world countries which CRS serves, and we will have a chance to sample some of those foods. The event will take place in the Hession Center, beginning roughly at 7:30 p.m.--after the Stations of the Cross are finished in church. Please join us if you can.

You will notice that our St. Charles statue has returned under the canopy in front of the Gathering Space. After some repairs it again looks like new. The statue was made by Hector Garcia, a well-known local artist, and installed in 1980. I'm sure that Monsignor Hession was watching the budget when he commissioned a statue in fiberglass instead of stone or bronze. Fiberglass statues are not recommended outdoors and typically don't have a long lifespan. However, our statue has held up pretty well, exposed in the weather for 42 years. It now has a new coat of epoxy and it is sheltered under the Gathering Space canopy. We are hoping for at least 42 more years.

For those who are especially observant, you may notice a change the next time you come for Confession. In those parts of the world using English, the Prayer of Absolution is changing a bit. Priests have been given a new English translation of the prayer, more faithful to the Latin. The changes are subtle. Instead of hearing that God the Father "sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sins," you will hear that He "poured out the Holy Spirit for the forgiveness of sins." In the old form the priest asked that God "give you pardon and peace." In the new translation, we ask that God "grant you pardon and peace." We are easing into the change; the new translation is authorized for use beginning with Ash Wednesday but not mandated until Divine Mercy Sunday, the week after Easter. Please be patient with priests who are stumbling with the words or reading them from an index card. I would make a wild guess that I have recited this prayer by memory a hundred thousand times. Subtle word changes won't come easily after all these years. It has been 13 years since we made changes in the translation of the Gloria and the Creed and I still get mixed up with those. And please note: if a tired or confused or forgetful priest accidentally uses the old translation, you should not panic. The absolution is still valid.

EUCHARISTIC SAINT FOR FEBRUARY ST. PETER DAMIAN

He was born in Italy in 988 AD. He lost both parents at an early age and was

treated cruelly by his eldest brother. He was a devout young man and an excellent student. He joined the Benedictine monks and became a prior in 1043. He was an ardent defender of the faith and was elevated to Cardinal in 1057. In 1053 he described a Eucharistic miracle that he directly witnessed. A sorceress asked a woman to bring her a consecrated Host. The woman went to Communion and hid the Host in her handkerchief. The priest stopped her and opened the handkerchief. To their surprise they saw that half of the Host had been transformed into flesh. St. Peter Damian died in 1073 and is recognized as a Doctor of the Church. His feast day is February 21. EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE SITE FOR FEBRUARY: ST. GASPAR DEL BUFALO PARISH, ROME CITY

Each month, you are invited to take a self-guided pilgrimage to a site of Eucharistic significance in the Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend. The February pilgrimage site is St. Gaspar del Bufalo Parish in Rome City. St. Gaspar was born in Rome, Italy in 1786. He was ordained in 1808, and, in 1815, he founded the Missionaries of the Most Precious Blood. He promoted devotion to the Blood of Christ by preaching missions and he opened an oratory where our Lord was worshipped all night. Pilgrims are invited to download a pilgrimage passport at diocesefwsb.org/eucharist and self "stamp" the passport each time you visit a site. If you missed a month, you may go back to that pilgrimage site and still selfstamp by writing the date of your visit. When six sites have been visited, bring the passport to Divine Mercy Gifts in South Bend or to Good Shepherd Books & Gifts in Fort Wayne to receive a free gift!

As part of the Eucharistic Revival, there will be a Revive city-wide mission night on Wed., April 12, at Bishop Dwenger High School, led by Damascus Missionaries. It will be a night with praise and worship, an inspirational speaker, and Eucharistic Adoration. Renew your own faith and invite a friend to come with you to encounter our God who is living and active. To reserve your seat, register at diocesefwsb.org/revive

Thanks again to the incredible generosity of St Charles parishioners, our recent blood drive netted 56 units. You have helped 168 people!







SCRIP NEWS

Now that all the numbers have been crunched, it's time to look back at the accomplishments of the SCRIP program in 2022. Total sales for last year were just over \$2.23 million. Within that total were

online RaiseRight sales of approximately \$181,280. This generated a total profit for the year of \$109,651.35, which was shared 50/50 with our SCRIP customers.

There were 443 St. Charles parish families and ministries that purchased SCRIP plus 54 non-parishioners. Also, 48 families bought SCRIP online through RaiseRight. Of the total families registered at St. Charles, this represents about 24% (or almost 1 in 4) who participate in the SCRIP program. Thank you to everyone who supported SCRIP through purchasing and volunteering in 2022!

If you are one of the 76% who didn't reap the benefits last year, it's not too late to start. SCRIP is not just for Christmas gift giving. Everyday purchases at the gas station and grocery store are a great way to begin. Also, SCRIP is not just for school tuition. There are many options of what you can do with your earned rebates. 

ABSTINENCE—All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

FASTING-All Catholics from their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday are bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting requires limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light nourishment may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Any good reason will excuse a person from these regulations on particular occasions and for health and dietary needs. Only a contemptuous violation of all regulations would be considered seriously wrong.


