

Our parish subscribes to the website and you can sign in for free. A note: when the

website asks for the parish name, I typed in *St. Charles Borromeo* and found a list of other St. Charles parishes, but not ours. Instead, type in our zip code, 46815, or our parish code, 600e3. You won't believe how many good options you will find on this site.

Over the past couple of weeks we have had microphone troubles. Some of our new equipment (still under warranty) has been giving us trouble. The folks who installed the system have been working with us, and I hope that the problems will have been ironed out by the time you read this bulletin.

Present also are a statue and first-class relic of Pope St. Pius X, who declared that children could receive their first Holy Communion at the age of seven. 17 banners with scripture passages and quotes from various saints regarding the Eucharist are on display. Eucharistic Saint for March St. Katharine Drexel

She was born into a prominent and wealthy Philadelphia family in 1858. Her parents were great philanthropists with a great affinity for the poor. Growing up Katharine developed a great love for the Eucharist. Her time in prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament helped develop a deep loving relationship with Christ. When she entered religious life, the local paper reported "Miss Drexel Enters a Catholic Convent – Gives up Seven Million." St. Katharine founded the Sisters of the Most Blessed Sacrament to serve Black and Indian Missions in the United States. Her life gives witness to the intense bond between eucharistic devotion and a life of service. St. Katharine's feast day is March 3rd. Learn more about her Eucharistic devotion at diocesefwsb.org/eucharist."

Eucharistic Reflection for March – Conversion.

"At Mass, we say: 'Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be Venial sins damage but do not destroy our communion with God and the Church. Reception of the Eucharist strengthens our charity and wipes away venial sins. while helping us to avoid serious sins. Mortal sins do rupture our communion with God and the Church. One commits a mortal sin by freely, knowingly, and willingly choosing to do something that involves grave matter and that is opposed to love of God and neighbor. A person in the state or mortal sin is not to receive Holy Communion without having received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. One who receives Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin does not receive the grace of the sacrament, but instead commits the sin of sacrilege by failing to show the reverence due our Eucharistic Lord. Read this month's full reflection at diocesefwsb.org/eucharist.'






