A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR!

Lent has begun. I hope that everyone has come up with a plan for this holy season. It is a time to concentrate our lives of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It is also a time to work on increasing virtues and weeding out vices. As we prepare for the great coming feasts, we ask the Lord to change us.

"The Light is On For You" is a diocesan-wide effort to have a priest available in every parish hearing confessions from 6:00 p.m. -8:00 p.m. on **Tuesday**, March 8. We will have a priest in the nursery, on the north side of our church Gathering Space. There will be a Mass going on from 6:30 p.m.-7:00 p.m. in the Gathering Space, but confessions will continue during the Mass. Spread the word, especially if you know someone who has been away from the sacrament.

This Wednesday evening is the Revive Mission, held at Bishop Dwenger High School from 6:30 p.m.-9:00 p.m. It is an event designed for people of all ages, with great speakers, quiet Adoration time, and time to reflect on the faith. Childcare will be provided for those with young children. You can register in advance at Damascus.net/reviveftwayne. There is a charge if you register at the door, but advance registration is free.

The third of our Lenten series presentations will be this **Thursday**, March 10, at 7:00 p.m. in the Hession Center. Casey Ryan will give a presentation on Evangelization: Sharing the Faith with others. Join us.

Remember that Stations of the Cross and Adoration are offered at St. Charles each **Friday** evening during Lent. Join us after the 6:30 p.m. Mass in the Gathering Space.

Fr. Koehl will be gone this week for retreat. Please keep him in prayer.

Renovation, Week 9: The terrazzo floor work continues. We are still hopefully waiting for sufficient chemicals to finish the floor, but a large portion has been poured. The plan is to bring the pews back into the church as soon as that is possible. A suspended ceiling is in the works around the periphery of the church, and cement blocks are now built in the area under the tabernacle.

My Week 9 photo is not a picture of St. Charles, but the Fort Wayne Cathedral. Many people were surprised by the news that there will be a pelican on our altar. In ancient mythology, it was told that a mother pelican would pierce her breast during a time of drought and feed her children with her own blood. This became a very common symbol of the Eucharist and is very commonly found on altars. Pictured here is the Cathedral altar. You will see a pelican with her three babies.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE—All Catholics who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

FASTING-All Catholics from their 18th birthday to their 59th birthday are bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting requires limiting oneself to one full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light nourishment may be taken on two other occasions during the day. Any good reason will excuse a person from these regulations on particular occasions and for health and dietary needs. Only a contemptuous violation of all regulations would be considered seriously wrong.
